BOARD WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHTS

Marketing Retail Service Solicitation Program – Fred Toettcher gave a detailed overview of the retail/service solicitation program. He presented findings from previous surveys, phase one conclusions, and overall objectives/benefits of this program.

Fiberstream - Ed Grollemand discussed the findings of the TDS Survey taken by Kahitians, which revealed that many Kahitians are unhappy with the current TDS service. He presented a proposal from Fiberstream, a local company that will be able to provide faster Internet service to Kahite. The proposal contained an overview of the company, potential resident pricing, recommendations, and conclusions.

Advisory Committee Selection – All nominees were approved. CMAC is now known as CAC (Communications Advisory Committee). A marketing committee will be created and details will be presented at the next Board meeting.

TICKETS ON SALE FOR SEE ROCK CITY



Below is a synopsis of the play:

Set in rural Kentucky during the pains of World War II, this award-winning play by Arlene Hutton is a tender portrayal of married life set against the backdrop of World War II, showing the best of the human spirit and its ability to overcome any and all obstacles.

The Story: Raleigh, unable to join the soldiers on the front because of his medical condition, fights a war at home against the criticism of family and townsfolk, while facing rejection letters as an aspiring writer. AUDITIONS SET FOR PLAYERS PRODUCTION OF NEIL SIMON'S "FOOLS"

Auditions for the Tellico Community Players' April/May production of Neil Simon's Fools will be held from 6-8 p.m., Friday January 12 and 2-4 p.m., Saturday, January 13 at the Tellico Community Playhouse (304 Lakeside Plaza) Tellico Village, Loudon. Directed by Patrick McCray and produced by Len Willis, Fools offers 10 roles: 3 male, two female and five that could be played by either a man or a woman. Production dates are April 26-28 and May 3-6. Rehearsals will begin in the first part of March.

Fools is a comedic fable about an idyllic Russian hamlet in the late 1800s. It features Leon Tolchinsky a teacher about 30 years old who has landed a job in the town, only to discover that the place has been cursed for 200 years by chronic stupidity. He finds people sweeping dust from the stoops back inside their houses and milking cows upside down to get more cream. Leon's job is to break the curse, but nobody tells him that if he stays over 24 hours and fails to break the curse, he too will become stupid. He falls in love with a girl so stupid that she only recently learned how to sit down.

American playwright and screenwriter Neil Simon is widely regarded as one of the most successful, prolific and performed playwrights in the world. PETS OF THE WEEK: MEET TINKERBELL AND POCONO!


Tinkerbell arrived at the Monroe County Animal Shelter with her 3 black & white kittens (all adopted). She is about 2 years old and a beautiful brown Chausie/Abyssinian mix with green eyes. She is very active and although she may be guarded initially, once she starts purring the house will shake. Chausies are highly intelligent, active, athletic cats that prefer to have human or cat companions around all the time. Tinkerbell has a delightful personality and possess man of the Chausie/Abyssinian traits. Pocono is a 1 year old domestic shorthair Calico/Tabby who came to shelter with 3 kittens. She is an active girl with perfect litter box manners. Although Pocono does not enjoy being picked up right now, over time with loving care and trust this may change. She is fine with other cats or dogs if introduced slowly and she is best with older respectful children. Pocono is a cat that will greet you when you come home and weave herself between your legs showing you she missed you while you were gone.

All animals adopted are spayed or neutered, have age appropriate vaccinations and testing, and are microchipped (with registration). Cats are litter box trained. \$40 adoption fee.
