

# TELLICO VILLAGE BROADCASTING: HEALTH CHAT

Join TVB Host Linda Crawford, TN 9th District (Loudon, Meigs, and Morgan Counties) Attorney General Russell Johnson and Charlene Hipsher, Community Liaison as they discuss the criminal and the social consequences and resulting costs of the opioid epidemic. Frequently, victims of crimes such as break-ins, theft and embezzlement are the parents and grandparents of the perpetrators who are addicts. The result is not only a growing strain on the criminal justice system, but on the family structure and the social welfare system. Johnson and his office believe the opioid addicted are targeted by pharmaceutical companies. That's why he and other TN attorney generals are suing the industry.
