### LIQUOR STORE COMING TO TELLICO VILLAGE

The Village has been asking for years to have a liquor store in Tellico Village. Several surveys have been conducted in the past asking Villagers what specific businesses they would like added to the community. One request that continues to arise in these surveys is the addition of a liquor store.

The current law states that a liquor store can only be licensed in an incorporated community and Tellico Village is not an incorporated community. However, an opportunity recently presented itself for the POA to work with local and state-level officials who sponsored an amendment to legislation that would allow the POA to own and operate a liquor store. The legislation was passed this week and will become law when signed. We will be evaluating the operational aspects of the project over the next couple of months.

There are two key benefits in adding a liquor store to Tellico Village. First, it will bring a service to our property owners who have repeatedly asked for it. Second, it will serve as income revenue for Tellico Village and will help offset some of the community's infrastructure costs (ex: maintaining roads). The location of the liquor store has not been decided, nor has an opening date been decided.

The Board as a whole feel that this is an exciting opportunity for the community and a win for the County as well. They see this as an example of how the Village can work with State and local governing officials on mutually benefiting projects.

As the project progresses, the POA will keep the public updated.

*Fools* is a comedic fable about an idyllic Russian hamlet in the late 1800s. It features Leon Tolchinsky a young teacher who has landed a job in the town, only to discover that the place has been cursed for 200 years by chronic stupidity. He finds people sweeping dust from the stoops back inside their houses and milking cows upside down to get more cream. Leon's job is to break the curse, but nobody tells him that if he stays over 24 hours and fails to break the curse, he too will become stupid. He falls in love with a girl so stupid that she only recently learned how to sit down. The play is directed by Patrick McCray, the director of dramatic arts and cinema studies at Webb School of Knoxville. It's the first time that the Players have used an outside director for a production. Three of McCray's students – Gwyneth Doppelt, Ben Hatmaker and Jake Yount have major roles in the cast of Fools. Lyn Cozadd is assistant director; Len Willis is producer.

### **RECONSTRUCTION AFTER THE CIVIL WAR**

May 8, 1:00 - 3:00 p.m., Chota Rec Room A

A fascinating time in American History taught by an expert college history professor. What can we learn from our history that helps us live in the present? Things you did not know...

Reconstruction in America meant two things: an era following the Civil War, and a process through which the American people redefined basic principles of freedom, equality and justice in the wake of the Civil War and emancipation. This class will explore the complex period after the Civil War concluded, including the political, Constitutional, economic and social crises that enveloped the South and the nation. Dr. Astor will also address the multiple factors that influenced the course of Reconstruction and its long-term implications up to the present day. Aaron Astor, Ph.D., is Associate Professor of History at Maryville College in Maryville, Tennessee. He has written numerous articles, conference papers and book chapters on the Civil War era, focusing especially on the Upper and Border South. He is the author of the recently released Rebels on the Border: Civil War, Emancipation and the Reconstruction of Kentucky and Missouri, 1860-1872 which examines the transformation of grassroots black and white politics in the Border South. Tuition for this class is \$5 payable to TVPOA at the class.

This is the premier fundraising event held by the TV Lions and it goes far in enabling the club to carry out its mission of "We Serve". 100% of the funds raised support the myriad of vision-related activities conducted by the club in Loudon County. The funds also support annual donations to a number of service organizations in Loudon County and the greater East Tennessee region.

The event is an 18-hole, best ball scramble with all male, all female or mixed foursomes. Prizes are awarded to the low net team in each category, as well as for the longest and most accurate drives and closest to the pin for both men and women. Each participant will also receive coffee, a continental breakfast, lunch, range balls, and a goody bag of neat gifts.

The rain date for the event is Saturday, May 19 at the same location. Funds are raised during the event from participant fees as well as by the purchase of sponsorships by local businesses. Donations are also made to the TV Library, TVVFD, Second Harvest, and the Lions Eye bank, Blind Industries and the Eye Center at Vanderbilt University as well as a number of other similar organizations. 

All animals adopted are spayed or neutered, have age appropriate vaccinations and testing, and are microchipped with registration. Cats are litter box trained. \$40 adoption fee over 2 years old, \$50 under 2 years.

SNAP (Spay Neuter Assistance for Pets) offers free vouchers to qualifying families for a spay or neuter procedure at participating local veterinarians. The next voucher session will be held Saturday, May 5th, at the Vonore Community Center (above the library), 10-11am. Vouchers are available to qualified Monroe County residents.
