

WHO BENEFITS FROM THE TELLICO VILLAGE MARKETING EFFORT?

The Tellico Village marketing program is about John and Loretta. Don and Dorthy. Jim and Joanne. They are all former Villagers who in the past two months have sold their homes and moved to other living arrangements outside the community.

These couples are all in their late 70s or early to mid-80s. They lived in the community for at least 12 years or more. Life's circumstances intervened, they needed to sell their homes and the proceeds from these transactions were used to finance their next life stage.

The over-arching objective for the marketing program since its inception in 2013 has been: "To build awareness of the Tellico Village brand and its unique appeals and benefits among national, regional and in-state audiences in order to influence the sale of Tellico Village homes and lots and strengthen property values." It is critically important that in an ageing community, such as Tellico Village, that older residents be able to sell their homes at a fair price and in a reasonable amount of time. For the majority of Tellico Villagers, their homes are a significant part of their net worth and their estates.

The three couples mentioned previously, sold at an opportune time. Property values have increased in the past 18 months (January, 2017 to June, 2018) by 12.9 percent. According to the Multiple Listing System (MLS), 443 existing homes have been sold during this period and the average increase in equity was \$29,221 per home. Total realized equity for all homes sold was \$12,945,014, with the bulk of these returns going to former, older residents who needed these types of gains.

A Village survey conducted in June, 2017 of new arrivals (January, 2014 to February, 2017) reported that 82% of these new Villagers had been influenced to purchase in TV by some element of the community's marketing program. In this case, two of the three purchasers of these ex-Villager's homes were attracted by the Village's marketing materials. The couples who sold also benefited from the shortest time on market in recent memory. From 2009 through 2013, average time on market for existing Village homes was seven to eight months. By June, 2018 time on market had shrunk to less than three months (2.9 months).

So, who benefits from the Village's marketing effort? Really, all Villagers – not just recent past residents, but all current residents, - because the equity in their homes has increased dramatically. The total unrealized equity gain across the entire community over the preceding 18 months is slightly more than \$194 million. Villagers should feel great about this performance. More importantly, they should be pleased, because their older friends, who have found it necessary to leave the community, have secured a fair return on their homes to help underwrite the next phase of their lives.

COMMUNITY CHURCH AT TELLICO VILLAGE PARKING LOT CLOSURE

The Community Church at Tellico Village is having the entire parking lot resurfaced August 27th - 31st. There will be no through traffic during that time. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

WELLNESS CENTER TEMPORARILY CLOSED UNTIL AUGUST 27TH

The award categories are as follows:

Community Service Award

(Service Outside Tellico Village)

Recognizes highly significant volunteer contributions by a Villager or a Village group to Tennessee communities outside Tellico Village, especially those in Loudon County and Monroe County. Recognizes devoted and effective voluntary service to social, recreational, environmental, management, and service-related programs within these communities.

Distinguished Service Award

(Service inside Tellico Village)

Recognizes highly significant volunteer contributions by a Villager or a Village group to Tellico Village. These contributions should be so noteworthy as to have a major effect on: the general health, welfare and/or enjoyment of the Village; or the quality of life in the Village; or the fulfillment of a major need in the Village.

Government Service Award

Recognizes a Villager who has contributed significantly to the well-being of surrounding communities by being involved in their public relations, government affairs, international development or commerce activities, or their business and civic/governmental organizations. This involvement should have inspired respect for, better relations with, and a greater appreciation of the Village.

Education Service Award

Recognizes a Villager who has contributed to the local school systems in a way that has significantly enhanced the learning experience of either local youth or local adults.

Outstanding Youth Award

Recognizes a Village youth, 21 years or younger, whose volunteer accomplishments significantly exceed the norm of expectations; whose efforts and services are a credit to the Village, reflect the spirit of caring, and are a good example for other youths. The recipient should have demonstrated leadership ability, initiative, and responsibility. Outstanding Individual Award

The committee will entertain nominations to recognize individuals who do not fall into any of these categories, so don't worry about trying to make the individual fit the award description.

Honor Award nomination forms are available at the POA office, Chota Recreation Center, The Wellness Center, Yacht Club, Tanasi, Toqua and Kahite clubhouses, and The Public Library at Tellico Village.

Note: Honor Awards are for Villagers only. To recognize an employee, use Above and Beyond forms available in Village facilities and online. Village residents who are also employees may be nominated for an Above and Beyond Award if the activity for recognition is part of their job.
