BOARD WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHTS

- **Board Candidates** The Board candidates were announced for this year's election. The Election Committee still needs to certify the nominations. The Board candidates for this year's election are Linda Bailey, Carla Johnson and Bruce Johnson.
- Kahite Internet Service (Fiberstream) Kevin Alfont, IT Manger gave an update in regards to the process and discussed the type of equipment proposed. He also discussed Fiberstream, the company we are currently vetting as a possible Internet provider for the Kahite neighborhood. Parker Owen, CFO, gave examples of the cost associated with adding Fiberstream into Kahite. He mentioned there are a lot of unknowns that we still need to look into. Kevin Stevens, POA Attorney, updated the legal aspect of the proposed deal. He stated that we have a lot to work on in coming to an agreement that he is comfortable with. They will continue to work on options for Internet and vet Fiberstream. Another update will be given to the Board at a future workshop.
- Budget & Five Year Plan (Inflation Rates) Parker Owen gave the Board background and options on the inflation rate recommendation. Leading into the Budget season, he is purposing using a 2.5% increase for next year's budget and 5-year plan.
- Rainwater/Residential Tanks Jeff Gagley, Director of Public Works, recapped the plan for fixing rain runoff that is effecting the tanks in residential yards. The rainwater during heavy rains is causing the tanks to set off alarms when they are taking on too much water. This is caused by the tanks being at

ground level. Public Works will be identifying the problem tanks and adding a 6-inch extender on top of the current lid. This will bring the tank lid above grade, which will keep future rainwater out of the sewer system. They have a plan to be more aggressive in locating and fixing these tanks. Changes will be made in the Blue Book to keep new tanks from being placed or backfilled at ground level.

- **Wellness Center Update** Simon Bradbury, Director Recreation, gave a full update in regards to all of the changes/renovations at the Wellness Center during the 10-day shut down. The recreation department has received a lot of positive comments and has made some minor adjustments based on feedback from members. The new pool dehumidifier system that was approved last month is being ordered. Once we get an install date and timeline, we will notify members.
- Other The Twilight Golf Trial was ratified and approved 7-0.

PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE

Recently, the Village has experienced what was once an insignificant factor but due to the growth of the Village, this matter has the attention of the Public Works Department. In the recent 5"rain event, it has become evident that our sewer system was taking on significant inflows of rainwater causing sewer alarms to go off throughout the Village. The problem starts when the landscaper is undertaking finish grade on your home when the home construction is complete. When a landscaper keeps the black lid covering the sewer tank flush with the final grade of the yard, this causes problems. When we have heavy rains causing standing water in the yards, the rain follows the path of least resistance, under the lid of your tank and into the tank. This causes systems to run to keep the water pumped down. The major problems arising from this situation are as follows: (1) it causes your sewer pump to run longer, using excess electricity and causing undue wear on components in the tank; (2) other homes systems are doing the same thing combining together causing high flow in the pumping station throughout the Village. During heavy rains, we experience an increase of the regular sewer flow; and (3) most critically is where all those stations pump to, the main sewer lift station. Once the rainwater enters the sewer system it becomes sewage, and the POA must pump it to the Loudon Utilities Treatment Plant (LUTP) for processing. During these heavy rains, the POA is pumping and paying for thousands of gallons of rainwater to be treated as sewage. You might ask: "OK, what does that problem mean to me?" Inflow results in thousands of dollars being spent to process clean rainwater as raw sewage. It also can give a false sense of needing to upgrade the POA sewer system with larger pumps and sewer mains. These upgrades would not be needed without the extra flow from rainwater coming into our sewer system. The inflow problem is fixed by adding an extension to the riser pipe of problem tanks. This raises the black cap above the ground surface about six inches so that rainwater stays in the yard and not into the sewer tank. Mulch will be added around the extension to hide the riser extension. Due to the recent heavy rains over the past couple of months, the Public Works department is stepping up this process throughout the Village. In order to properly manage this situation, we are enhancing our normal procedures and you may receive a knock on your door letting you know work will be performed on your system. We will notify you before any work is done. If you have experienced this issue and would like to report it to the Public Works Department, please call 865-458-4522. We will also be updating the Blue Book in order to add rules to keep landscapers and builders from back filling around the tanks after we install them. The tank lid will be required to be 6 inches above ground. This will be checked after the landscaping has been installed. The POA Utilities department looks forward to making these enhancements throughout the Village.

Community Service Award

Recognizes devoted and effective voluntary service to social, recreational, environmental, management, and service-related programs within these communities.

Distinguished Service Award

(Service inside Tellico Village)

Recognizes highly significant volunteer contributions by a Villager or a Village group to Tellico Village. These contributions should be so noteworthy as to have a major effect on: the general health, welfare and/or enjoyment of the Village; or the quality of life in the Village; or the fulfillment of a major need in the Village.

Government Service Award

Recognizes a Villager who has contributed significantly to the well-being of surrounding communities by being involved in their public relations, government affairs, international development or commerce activities, or their business and civic/governmental organizations. This involvement should have inspired respect for, better relations with, and a greater appreciation of the Village.

Education Service Award

Recognizes a Villager who has contributed to the local school systems in a way that has significantly enhanced the learning experience of either local youth or local adults.

Outstanding Youth Award

Recognizes a Village youth, 21 years or younger, whose volunteer accomplishments significantly exceed the norm of expectations; whose efforts and services are a credit to the Village, reflect the spirit of caring, and are a good example for other youths. The recipient should have demonstrated leadership ability, initiative, and responsibility. Outstanding Individual Award


