We take exceptional pride in our hiking trails, which are available due largely in part to the vision of Recreation Director Simon Bradbury, as well as the dedication of the Public Works Department and several Village volunteers affectionately known as the "Chain Gang."

Tellico Village currently has around 13 miles of hiking trails including those in Kahite, with plans to continue expansion of the trail network. Recreation Director, Simon Bradbury, has plans for over 20 additional miles of trails in the future.

Tickets on sale for Tellico Players October drama, Outside Mullingar

Reserved seats at \$21 for the Tellico Community Players October drama Outside Mullingar are on sale on the Players website www.TellicoCommunityPlayhouse.org. (Click on tickets to purchase.) Play dates are Thursday-Saturday, October 4-6 and Thursday-Sunday, October 11-14.

John Patrick Shanley's Tony-nominated play is set in rural Ireland and loosely based on Shanley's Irish ancestors. It's a tale about two lifelong introverted misfit-neighbors who grow into adulthood caring for aging parents.

Anthony Reilly (Russ Rinehart) and Rosemary Muldoon (Sauni Rinehart) each represent their own dilemmas. Anthony has spent his entire life on a cattle farm in rural Ireland, a state of affairs – due to his painful shyness – that suits him well. Rosemary lives right next door, determined to have him, and watching the years slip away. Rosemary's mother Aoife (Efa) Muldoon (Doris Ryan), is ailing, but she is a sharp, straight-shooting "old bird" who doesn't suffer fools gladly.

With Anthony's father Tony (George Arwood) threatening to disinherit him and a land feud simmering between their families, Rosemary has every reason to fear romantic catastrophe. But then, in this very Irish story with a surprising depth of poetic passion, these yearning, eccentric souls fight their way toward solid ground and some kind of happiness.

"Outside Mullingar is a compassionate, delightful work about how it's never too late to take a chance on love," says Dennis Loy, the play's director. "The journey of these folks is heartbreaking, full of Irish humor, and ultimately deeply moving."

Sue Aukerman is assistant director and Don Morton is producer of the show.

UPDATED TDOT INFORMATION

The contractor for TDOT started work on Sunday night September 30 to lay down asphalt in low spots along Highway 444. Beginning Monday night, working from 9PM to 6AM Sunday through Thursday, the contractor will start actual paving of the main lanes. After the main lanes are paved the contractor will come back and pave the shoulders. For the engineers in the Village, the process starts with a sprayed tack coat. This acts as a primer to help the asphalt bond to the existing highway surface. The new asphalt, called D-Mix, will be 1.25 inches thick. This is the same durable asphalt used on interstate highways. The contractor should be able to pave about two miles per night and if there are no further rain delays they should be finish in about two weeks. After the paving is completed, another contractor will replace most of the galvanized guard rail with the brown powered coated guard rail. **Other Village paving includes**; Tanasi parking lot will start Sunday night and should be completed Monday night if all goes well. Toqua and Chota will start Wednesday the10th if everything goes as planned.

MIDDLE PRONG TRAIL TO INDIAN FLATS FALLS

Distance: 8.2 miles

Elevation Gain: 1000 feet (gradual)

The trail is one of the most beautiful sections of the Great Smoky National Park near Townsend and Tremont. The trail follows the rushing Middle Prong of the Little River, and features overlooks of waterfalls, cascades and rapids cut through a narrow gorge. This hike follows a wide old logging railroad bed up a gentle slope with 1000 feet of gain. Indian Flats Falls are a strand of four falls on Indian Flats Prong. Since the hike is between 2000 and 3000 feet elevation, the temperature will be lower than in Tellico Village.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended.

Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike.

Bring water and a trail lunch.

Carpooling is recommended, passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver to help cover gas, etc.



LONG RANGE STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

Long Range Planning Advisory Committee

Over 40% of Tellico Village property owners completed the Long Range Strategic Plan (LRSP) Questionnaire. This level of participation is unprecedented and the Long Range Planning Advisory Committee (LRPAC) wants to thank all you who took the time to help, "Shape Our Future". This input will be an important element in the committee's final recommendations to the POA. The final LRSP will include other sources of information including data analysis and forecasting, benchmarking other active adult communities, focus groups, and much more. We are still analyzing the results which include reviewing over 1,900 comments. As promised, one of the basic tenets of the LRPAC is communication and transparency. Therefore the LRPAC will now share some partial and preliminary results.

Vision

- •61% of respondents chose the following vision statement: Maintain what we have, adding amenities only when needed and justified. Assessments and fees will be raised only enough to pay for infrastructure maintenance and justified amenities.
- •33% of respondents chose the following vision statement: Tellico Village will set the standard for active adult communities by continuously improving our community and by adapting to our property owners' changing needs. Assessments and fees will be increased to achieve a best in class community with a high-quality lifestyle but remain competitive and fiscally stable.
- •5% of respondents chose the following vision statement: Maintain the Village as it is without adding additional amenities or expanding existing facilities. Assessments and fees will only be increased for existing infrastructure maintenance and inflation.
- •The "Vision" results were similar across age and residency bands.
- •51% of respondents want to keep TV primarily as a retirement community and 38% supported encouraging working adults and families to move into TV.

Demographics

- •85% of respondents were 60-79 years of age; 9% were younger than 59; 6% were older than 80.
- •38% of households had lived in the Village less than 5 years; 21% 5-10; 33% 11-20; 9% 20+ years.

Top Priorities

- •Village finances, aesthetics and environment, growth, recreational amenities, and property owners' vision for the future of the Village were chosen as the 5 top priorities.
- •Finance was the number 1 priority issue.
- •84% of respondents are satisfied with TV's aesthetics but many comments suggested concern for the future. Concerns included maintaining our natural environment and enforcement of Village rules.
- •Our restaurants, recreational facilities, waterfront, and golf were all chosen as enhancing the value of TV. Commercial businesses had the lowest percentage of responses to this question.
- •Overwhelmingly, our recreational facilities (golf, wellness center, etc.) met or exceeded expectations.

Growth

- •67% of respondents were very satisfied or satisfied with our current and projected growth, 13% were very dissatisfied or dissatisfied.
- •When asked how the POA should approach growth 53% of respondents chose "encourage growth and plan for it" while 38% chose "allow growth to occur passively"

The next step in the development of the Long Range Strategic Plan will be conducting focus groups. Over 600 Villagers volunteered to participate in the focus groups. Hike Description: Those looking for an easy hike will enjoy this 3.1 mile relatively flat trail which loops around Indian Boundary Lake, which is in the south zone of the Cherokee National Forest off the Cherohala Skyway. The trail has picturesque lake and mountain views. Following the hike, we will have lunch at Tellico Kats Deli, located at 1829 Cherohala Skyway.

After lunch, first timers should stop at the Cherohala Skyway Visitor Center in Tellico Plains to learn more about what the area has to offer. The Cherohala Skyway is a 43 mile National Scenic Byway which goes from Tellico Plains to Robbinsville, N.C. Next to the visitor center is the Charles Hall Museum, which contains an eclectic display of historical artifacts collected by the former mayor of Tellico Plains. There is no admission fee for the museum, which is housed in two separate buildings.

Driving directions: Take Tellico Parkway south to Hwy 72. Turn left onto Hwy 72 and proceed to Hwy 411 at Vonore. Turn right onto Hwy 411 and proceed south to Madisonville. Take the Hwy 68 off ramp in Madisonville. Turn left onto Hwy 68 towards Tellico Plains. In Tellico Plains, turn left onto TN 165/Cherohala Skyway (approximately 12 miles from Madisonville) and drive 14 miles to the Indian Boundary Lake turnoff (Forest Road 345). Turn left onto FR 345. In 1.3 miles, FR 345 branches. Take the left branch to the stop sign. Turn right at the stop sign and follow the road 1.1 miles to the swimming beach parking area. Restrooms are available at the parking area.

In the event of a situation requiring medical intervention during a hike, we suggest that each participant wear their Name Tag and bring a Photo ID (generally driver's license) and Medical Information cards (Health Insurance Card or Medicare + supplemental Health Insurance Cards)

Cost: Passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver to help cover gas. Also, there is a \$3.00 per day usage fee to park at the lake.


