## LUB Maintenance to Affect Village Water

Tellico Village Public Works has switched to Tellico Area Services System (TASS) as the sole source for Village water for two to three weeks. This is in response to Loudon Utility Board's (LUB) short-notice maintenance on their clear well.

### What is the impact on Village water?

- There is NO change to the quality, taste or chemistry of the water. Public Works successfully worked with TASS and LUB a few years ago to get the chemistry the same from the two suppliers.
- Villagers will experience decreased water pressure during the two- to three-week maintenance period. The decreased water pressure will be more pronounced in the northern portion of the Village and at properties located on higher ground.
- Public Works is asking all Village property owners to limit the use of irrigation systems during this time to help lessen the effects on water pressure.

### **TVKWO Home Tour at Kahite May 5**

#### **Fiesta Kahite— Mi Casa es Su Casa**

The Tellico Village Kahite Women's Organization, TVKWO, will be holding their annual Home Tour noon-5 p.m. May 5. This year we have four spectacular, yet uniquely different homes on the tour. Special events are also planned this year. Chef Michael, formally of EATS Café, and his wife Lisa will not only have their home on the tour, but Chef Michael will be cooking tapas in his outdoor kitchen. For an additional cost you will be invited to taste the chef's creations.

Michael Janke moved to East Tennessee in 1998 after a distinguished culinary career. He was trained in Germany and served as executive chef at the Hyatt Regency Corporation. Immediately prior to relocating Michael was Executive Chef at the Palm Steak House in Atlanta, Georgia. The Janke Home's most unique attribute is that it was the first building permit to be issued in the Kahite neighborhood. Michael and Lisa were drawn to their property by its unique location on both the lake and golf course. The couple was mindful in creating an open atmosphere for entertaining guests and family as can be seen in their open kitchen and dining room. The eclectic modern decor within the home creates an exquisite atmosphere among the works from local artisans. Lisa was born and raised in Monroe County. Lisa and Michael have two children; they enjoy entertaining family and friends in their Kahite home.

At the Greene's home, Tom will have his vintage cars and motorcycles on display. Tom currently has 2 TOY cars. Tom sold his 1966 Shelby GT350 race car, which he vintage raced for 24 years, and then downsized by purchasing the Cobra. The Cobra is a Superformance, constructed in 1995 at the Cobra factory and sold through Bob Bondurant's facility in Arizona. There are very few people in the world who have as much experience in a Cobra as Bob Bondurant. The other "toy car" is his 2008 Shelby GT500 convertible. The engine in this car makes 650 or 750 rear-wheel horsepower depending on which supercharger pulley is installed. They purchased this car as a reward, because Tom spent nearly all of 2007 in Germany on a consulting job to launch a new transmission. Also on display is Phyllis' 2005 Thunderbird. They ordered it because it was both the anniversary car and the last Thunderbird to be built. While you tour the Greene's home, you are invited to enjoy light refreshments on their expansive patio. You may even find some Mexican

Graduating from UT's jazz program in 2011, Thad has been blessed to study with all the great UT jazz faculty including Greg Tardy and Jerry Coker. Thad continues to seek out private instruction and feels fortunate to have studied with Matt Wilson in New York.

David, Scott and Thad currently have a regular Friday night and Sunday brunch gig at Pero's On The Hill.
