Public Works Cleans Up

Public Works has added a new weapon to its cleaning arsenal: An American Hotsy pressure washer with a flat-surface brush, foam cannon, and 50-foot hose.


According to John Holbo, using this new tool will cut labor time in half, and with a water pressure of 4,000 psi, docks, concrete areas around the clubhouses and Yacht Club will be cleaned thoroughly – even of food drippings.

“This pressure washer is great,” said Holbo, as he demonstrated the ease of use and effectiveness on the dock at Tanasi. “We purchased this from Washing Equipment of Tennessee. The owner, Frank Smith, demonstrated it to us at Kahite and thoroughly trained us

in its ease of use. Plus he threw in some extras, like the 50-foot hose and the foam cannon.

Doug Ballard then took it and continued cleaning the docks.

“This is going to make Doug’s job easier,” said Holbo. “He can now get all of the goose poo off the dock easily so it doesn’t get tracked into the restaurant. Believe me, it beats trying to shovel it – plus it is quicker and gets it cleaner. I think our property owners will appreciate that.”

In the past, pressure washing companies were hired to clean the concrete, and a typical household pressure

washer does not have the power required to remove stepped on food stains, etc. And the wand connects easily and safely to the flat-surface brush – which controls the water in the area being cleaned.

Public Works estimates annual savings will be \$6,000 in both man hours and contractor fees. Plus POA workers take great pride in their work and will no doubt do a more thorough cleaning than an outside company.

Library Opening Brings Out a Crowd

Approximately 150 people gathered on Saturday afternoon, April 20, in the sunlit courtyard of the new library to witness the dedication ceremony for The Public Library at Tellico Village.

Special presentations included Representative Matlock bringing greetings from Governor Haslam; Mayor Herron presenting a proclamation dedicating April 20 as Public Library Day in Loudon County; Ruth McQueen and Beth Mercer, officials in the Loudon County and Ocoee River Region library systems, noting that the Village facility leads all other public libraries in Loudon County in circulation and is a model for volunteer efficiency and effectiveness system-wide. Gregor Smee, Smee & Busby Architects of Knoxville, explained our facility's sustainable design and eligibility for LEED (Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design) certification status from the U.S. Green Building Council. And, finally, Chris Miller, representing the GFWC Tellico Village Women's Club presented a check for \$4075 to fund this year's Children and Adult Summer Reading Program.

Carolyn McDermott also noted some of the outstanding interior and exterior contributions, specifically the generous naming gifts for sections of the library, landscaping (Village Garden Club and Prees Trees), artistic
