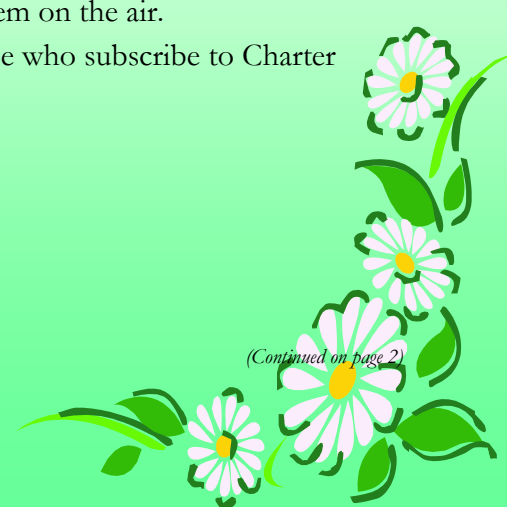
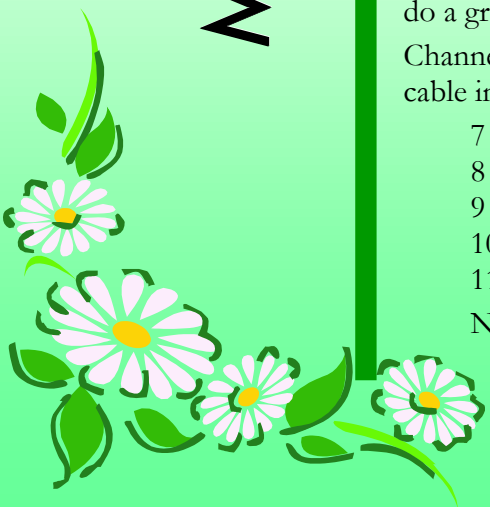
### Have you seen Channel 3 lately?

# Recent Events and Bragging Rights

## Library Book Sale Brings Home the Bacon

The 19th Annual Used Book Sale to benefit The Public Library at Tellico Village netted \$12,330. An active Friday morning, an increase in sales to book dealers, and additional hours on Friday and Saturday combined to make this the third best book sale ever. Only 2008 (\$14,150) and 2010 (\$13,040) were better. Nearly 35,000 books were donated for the 2013 sale with mysteries, romance, fiction, cookbooks, history books and biographies well represented. Special this year was books from the private library of Ray Mears, UT Basketball Coach 1963-1977. Donated by the Mears family, the books, many signed by prominent sports figures, generated much interest and many sales. All books remaining after the sale were donated to local charities or libraries to benefit their programs.

This event would not have been such a huge success without the dedicated volunteers who gave so much of their time and effort. Tellico Village is a prime example of why Tennessee is called the Volunteer State. It started with 20-25 people shivering at the warehouse every Friday for 12 weeks *before the actual set-up*, then came 90 folks handling multiple shifts to *set up* the book sale, followed by 35 folks handling 54 shifts who worked the *actual* book sale and ended with 33 folks who *broke it all down* and returned the church auditorium to its previous setup in record time.



Some of you perhaps wondered what we did with the books that did not get sold by the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Book Sale, this is the breakdown of the books remaining after the sale:

The Public Library at Tellico Village kept 19 boxes for next year's sale (DVD, current, large print classics, signed books)

The remaining books were donated as follows:

- Good Neighbor – 100 boxes (mystery, fiction, romance, adventure, media, cook books, children's)
- Hospital – 35 boxes (mystery, fiction, romance)
- Vonore Library – 28 boxes (mystery, fiction, romance)
- Habitat – 150 boxes (various – anything but political, business, fitness, religion, health or government)
- Prison – 4 boxes (western/adventure, light romance)
- Child Advocacy Center – 1 box (children/teenage)
- McKay/Internet – 1 box (possible sellable items)
- Military – 29 boxes (romance, mystery, fiction, adventure)
- Karen Frankhouser – 27 boxes (assorted hard and soft covered books and VHS)
- Loudon Health Center – 2 boxes (light romance, spiritual)
- Charity reseller – 192 boxes (anything no one else wanted)

In total 588 boxes were donated to local charities or libraries to benefit their programs. Again we would like to thank all of you who donated books or worked the book sale!
