Hike to Observation Point Loop Trail at Norris Dam March 11

The Muddy Boots Hiking Club will depart 8 a.m. Monday, March 11 (March 18 rain date), from Chota Center (across from the gas station) to hike:

- Observation Point Loop Trail at Norris Dam
- Distance: 3.7 miles
- Elevation Gain: Approximately 480 feet
- Rating: Easy to moderate
- Driving time: 1 hour
- Leader: Joe and Julie Kiehm

Hiking boots are recommended. Bring ample water and some snacks. The hike should conclude by noon with an optional lunch at a local restaurant near the park. Driving Directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Car-pooling is recommended and will be set up the morning of the hike. Passengers are asked to contribute \$5 to the driver to help cover gas.

This is a great hike on land originally acquired by TVA as part of Norris Dam, on trails developed by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930s. The hike begins on scenic Clear Creek at a historic gristmill and follows along a stream before rising to a view atop Reservoir Hill and Observation Point where the view is beautiful, looking northwest to Norris Dam, with the Clinch River flowing below, and the Cumberland Mountains rising in the background. Towards the end of the hike, we will be on a narrow trail, where the view is the high point of the hike, for those who just want to take pictures.
