## **Some Other Stuff You Need to Know...**

### **Library update**

A recent high volume rain event occurred in our community and impacted The Public Library at Tellico Village. Specifically, our cistern tank and piping was overloaded and rain accumulated in the back courtyard to a depth that allowed seepage into the building, principally under an exterior door by the Librarian's office.

While there was no standing water anywhere, carpets were wet in portions of the offices, hallway, conference room, children's area and computer lab. A service was immediately called in to dry out the carpets and, for safety reasons the Library was closed for three days. Work is now complete.

To remedy this situation so that it does not happen again, our building contractor, Wilson Construction, will replace the cistern tank with a larger one at no cost to the Library. This work will begin later this month and conclude in July. At the same time some of the cistern piping will be enlarged to provide better drainage. Until these corrections can be made we will step up our vigilance of possible extreme rain events and react accordingly.

with flame.

The trail to the Bald begins in the back of Cades Cove (we must drive the loop). It climbs steadily and unrelievedly uphill, with the last quarter mile being as steep as any trail in the park. The Bald is on the main spine of the Smokies, and you can feel the change in climate, so even on a warm day, bring a light jacket. You will need it after the exertion of the climb. As with any spectacular reward, this one takes effort. On the way down you can congratulate yourself for seeing a special part of the park that only a hardy few can experience.

The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 12-2 will present About Boating Safely 1-5 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday, June 25 and 27, in the Yacht Club. The cost is \$45 (couples/families

who share course materials may attend for \$10 per additional person) including text, exam and certificate; Students under 16 years of age (proof please) will receive a \$25 discount. All students who must comply with TN Mandatory Boater Education Law will be provided with a proctored Tennessee Exam. Fees will be collected at first class.

This boating class will give you the knowledge needed to obtain a boat license or safety certification in many states. Successful completion of the course and multiple choice exam will earn you a safe boating certificate. Many boat insurance companies will offer discounts on boating insurance to boaters who successfully complete About Boating Safely.

According to Tom Murphy, "Successful participants in this class will be rewarded with a U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Safe Boating Certificate. Any Tennessee resident born after Jan. 1, 1989, must show the TWRA-issued wallet Boating Safety Education Certificate as proof of successful completion of the TWRA Boating Safety exam. This exam will be proctored at the end of this class. Please indicate when registering if you require the Tennessee exam.

This is an excellent class for new and intermediate boaters and any boater that needs evidence of a U.S. Coast Guard boating safety class for the purpose of obtaining an insurance premium discount, joining T-Bart, boat rentals or to obtain your Tennessee State boating permit."
