Progress on Senior Living Complex

Back in March, I updated our property owners on the progress we are having on the senior living development area near The Neighborhood. The Tellico Village POA has finally acquired the approximately 15 acres of undeveloped property surrounding The Neighborhood. Our objective is to complete the Senior Living Complex project that was begun in 2000.

For a few years now, we have been working on resolution to that, and in early April we reacquired the land. The next step will be to find a developer to take on the task of completing the vision for that area.

In the article following this one, Board President Joe Marlette has a well-written article outlining the details of this situation. Stay tuned for more updates as we make progress on this important project.

From the Boardroom

Tellico Village Senior Living Complex

The Tellico Village POA has finally acquired the undeveloped property surrounding The Neighborhood, approximately 15 acres, with the objective of completing the Senior Living Complex project that was begun in 2000.

The POA sold approximately 25 acres to Tellico Senior Living (Health Solutions) in 2000 to develop a Senior Living Complex in response to the need for such a facility, as suggested by a group of property owners. Over the next few years, The Neighborhood (50 assisted living units and a memory care unit) was built and operated by Tellico Senior Living and 22 independent living condominiums were built and bought by Villagers. The original development plan called for 99 independent living condominiums surrounding The Neighborhood at full build-out.

Around the 2007 timeframe, development ceased and eventually Tellico Senior Living defaulted on its contract with the POA to complete the project. Tellico Senior Living sold The Neighborhood facility to Five Star in 2003, but the 22 independent living condominiums remain as an independent association, not officially connected to The Neighborhood.

Starting in 2008, the POA board and staff initiated action to buy back the remaining undeveloped land, in accordance with an option contained in the contract with Tellico Senior Living, at the original sales price for the land. It was the intention of the POA board at that time to complete the project, as the need was still there and growing for independent living facilities for those wishing to downsize with an easy connection to The Neighborhood for medical assistance, meals and social interaction.

Winston Blazer, our POA General Manager, gave an update on this process in a March article in the Connection. In early May, the POA competed the re-purchase of the undeveloped land after five years of litigation. During this

time, the POA has been discussing completion of the project with developers. Many things have changed in the 13 years since this project was initiated and there may be modifications to the original project scope, but the POA is diligently pursuing completion of this project. The POA hopes to be in a position to communicate more specific plans for completion of this project in the near future.

Your POA Board and Staff are excited about the prospect of completing this vision for the benefit of the property owners. We believe that this project can add value to our community and can also provide a foundation for more initiatives to meet the growing needs of our population. The POA will incorporate the information from the HOA Focus Groups initiative as it proceeds with development efforts. I will be participating in the HOA forum on the STAYinTV initiative on Thursday, July 11, from 1 to 3 p.m. at the Community Church. I hope Villagers take the opportunity to come hear about progress on these initiatives.

We will communicate more details about this important project in the weeks and months ahead. Thanks for your patience through this long legal process.

This trail begins at the circular parking area of the picnic area at Cades Cove. Spence Field is quite a challenge. The trail is very rocky and steep but the rewarding view at Spence Field is well worth the effort. Most of the guide books describe the trail as one of the most rewarding in the park. A good supply of water and high energy food is needed especially if the weather is hot. We should arrive at Spence Field in time for lunch. At the shelter near Spence Field, there is a spring, but the water needs to be treated. Hiking pole(s) are very helpful on this hike.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike.

Bring water and a trail lunch. Carpooling is recommended, passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver to help cover gas, etc. For more information, go to www.tvhikers.com.

Nextdoor.com Tips



Nextdoor.com has more than 1,700 members in the Village and the site is growing every day. It has proved to be popular for posting classified ads and recommendations for services. One advantage to the site is that it is only available to residents, and all requests for membership

must be approved by one of the “Leads.”

Sometimes members complain about the amount of email they receive, but there’s an easy resolution to that problem. Every member should check their *Settings*, where email changes can be made. To make changes, click on your name in the upper right corner and select *Settings*. At the top of the next screen, select *Email*. This is where you make your choices about the kind and volume of email you wish to receive.

Posting items in the classifieds is simple and straightforward—there are no categories to worry about. If you want to make a recommendation or are seeking a recommendation, however, you should not make a “general” post. When you first click *Recommendations*, you’ll see a listing at the top of overall categories. Select your category to see a listing of subcategories. If you’re looking for a dentist, for example, select “Medical and Dental,” then select “Dentist” and check the currently posted listings. You may find your answer without having to post another “Do you know a good ...” message. For a complete listing of the categories cross-referenced by topic, go to *Documents* and select “Recommendations: Selecting the right category.” And when you post your recommendation, make sure your title gives readers a clear picture of the message!

Nextdoor.com is meant to be a medium for sharing information, not a social network such as Facebook. Whereas messages such as “I’m so glad you found your cat!” are nice, they do make sifting through information more tedious. (Remember, you can always send a “private” message.)

Messages with questionable content may be “flagged” (click the dropdown arrow, then *Flag*) and the Leads will review them for possible deletion. The Leads will always remove postings with offensive language or those promoting political or religious views. And remember, you may always delete your own messages if you think they have no further value to the community (e.g., you found your cat).

Finally, if you want to know how to do something on the site, check *Documents* first. You may find your answer is already there!
