This trail is a pleasant hiking experience winding along the shoreline of Powerline Cove and the main channel of Tellico Lake. Last year East Lakeshore Trail was placed on the National Register of Hiking Trails.

Hiking boots and hiking stick(s) are recommended. Because of the amount of rain this year, the trails tend to be a bit narrow in places due to vegetation growth, so long pants are recommended. Bring ample water and a trail snack. Driving instructions will be distributed at the Chota Center and \$2 per person to the driver is suggested.

With the river on the left side of the trail, the right side is mostly lined with very large and picturesque rock formations. You will see many kayaks, canoes, and people fishing for river trout from its banks or using waders to get further into the stream. The trail itself is shaded and mostly narrow with only room for walking single file. Hiking boots and hiking stick(s) are recommended and bring ample water and a trail lunch. There are restrooms at the Big Bend Trailhead and Childers Creek parking lots and at the picnic area.
