***Tee It Forward in Full Swing***

The long awaited permanent black tees have been completed at Tanasi and are open for play. Toqua has also begun construction of their permanent black teeing areas. The black tees at each course measure approximately 4,400 yards and are commensurate with the black tees at Kahite.

The *Tee It Forward* initiative encourages golfers to play from a yardage that best suits their abilities and from which they find the most playing enjoyment. The black tees have been created with that in mind and will provide all golfers (both male and female) with an additional tee choice.

The current black tee course and slope ratings for men and women have been calculated following the USGA Guide for unrated tees and can be posted in GHIN. The official ratings will be completed later this fall. The white, orange, green, and black tees will be USGA

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rated for both men and women at that time.
