Hike Charlie's Bunion Aug. 9

The Tellico Village Hiking Club will leave Chota Center 8 a.m. Friday, Aug. 9, to hike:

This challenging trail begins at Newfound Gap in Smoky Mountains National Park. The trail traverses some of the most spectacular views in the Smokies. The steady climb over the course of the first two miles will lead to a distant observation of the North Carolina Smokies. At the 2.7 mile point, you will pass Icewater Spring Shelter. This water is cold, but should not be drunk without treatment. Many hikers rate the next two miles as some of the most spectacular in the Smokies. The view from the Bunion makes all the effort worthwhile.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Bring water and a trail lunch. Carpooling is recommended. Passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver for to help cover cost of gas, etc. For more information, go to www.tvhikers.com.

Hike Observation Point Loop Trail Aug. 12

This is a great hike on land originally acquired by TVA as part of Norris Dam, on trails developed by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930s. Begin on scenic Clear Creek at a historic gristmill. Explore the primitive power plant from the outside, parts of which have been in operation since 1798. We will travel along the stream (should be good for wildflowers) before rising to a view atop Reservoir Hill. From Reservoir Hill we continue to our next stop at Observation Point which will complete our rise in elevation. The view is beautiful here, looking northwest to Norris Dam, The Clinch River flowing below, and the Cumberland Mountains rising in the background. Towards the end of the hike we will be on a narrow trail with a steep slope on our left. The view here is the high point of the hike, for those who just want to take in the view or take pictures.

Hiking boots are recommended. Bring ample water and some snacks. We will stop at a local restaurant for lunch after the hike.

Car-pooling is recommended and will be set up the morning of the hike. Passengers are asked to contribute \$5 to the driver to help cover gas.
