Another Dam Bridge Update

Jeff Gagley from Public Works and John Cherry from Public Relations went out to the Fort Loudoun and Tellico Dam construction area this week to get an update on the project from Matthew Smith and Chris Bongfeldt of Parsons Brinckerhoff, the project management company for TDOT.

The project is relatively on schedule in spite of the abundance of rain we have received this year.

The next traffic pattern change will occur in late November or early December. We will communicate what that change is as soon as we have more specific data from TDOT. Part of that traffic change will occur to accommodate the TVA project to replace the flood baskets with permanent walls and berms.

Once again, the TVPOA will try to provide updates to this project and its affect on traffic as

soon as we know details.

Below is the latest email update directly from Parsons Brinckerhoff:

Roadway:

- Approximately 254,000 of the 669,802 cubic meters of fill material is in place and this operation will continue until complete
- Storm drain installation continues as the contractor reaches the necessary grades with their fill material
- All utility work (water, sewer and gas) that can be placed at this time is installed. This work will continue as construction phasing allows.
- As roadway slopes are being completed topsoil is being placed and stabilized with seed, straw and matting for permanent stabilization.

Bridge:

- Bridge #1 (over Norfolk Southern Railroad): Phase I Construction of the bridge over Norfolk Southern Railroad is progressing. The bridge deck was poured on Tuesday, August 13th. The approach slabs and parapet wall construction will begin immediately.
- Bridge #2 (over TN River): Abutment #1 is under construction. The abutment beam and wing wall footings are poured. The backwall and wing walls will be poured once beams are set.
- Bridge #3 (over Tellico Canal): Abutment #1 is under construction. The abutment beam and wing wall footings are poured. Abutment #2 is complete.

In order to install storm drain and curb and gutter at the intersection of SR73 and SR2, the right-turn ramp from SR2 NB to SR73 has been closed. The existing island has been modified to allow for a left turn at the intersection.

Elm Hill Rd remains closed at the intersection with City Park Drive in order to complete fill and storm drain installation. Due to the amount of rain on site over the past six weeks this closure will remain for approximately one more month to complete the operations.
