Hike Meigs Creek/Curry Mountain Aug. 28

The Tellico Village Hiking Club will leave Chota Center 8 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 28, to hike:

- Distance: 8.7 miles
- Elevation Gain: 900 feet
- Rating: Moderate
- Driving Time: 1 hr. 15 min.

The trailhead for Meigs Creek Trail is at The Sinks, two miles from Metcalf Bottoms on Little River Road. Hikers will have an immediate photo op at The Sinks, and shortly thereafter at Meigs Falls. During the 3.5 miles we are on this trail, we will encounter 18 (we counted them) stream crossings. Typical low water in late August hopefully should make these easy rock hops. At the Meigs Mountain Trail, we will hike 1.9 miles to the Curry Mountain Trail, which will return us to Metcalf Bottoms. There is a small family cemetery along the way to visit and a couple of scenic openings in the trail as well. We should reach Campsite 19 about lunchtime, providing a good place for our break.

This is a shuttle hike. We will leave one car at Metcalf Bottoms and drive the remaining cars two miles to The Sinks to begin our hike. Hiking sticks are especially recommended because of the stream crossings.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Bring water and a trail lunch. Carpooling is recommended. Passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver for to help cover cost of gas, etc. For more information, go to www.tvhikers.com.

Kiwanis KARES

Is your club looking for a good project for your Human and Spiritual Values Committee? There is no Kiwanis International branded program to help this committee. Fortunately for you, the Kiwanis Club of Tellico Village has developed and tested a program that may help your club meet the human needs of the elderly in your club's service area.

Kiwanis KARES—a True Human-Needs Volunteer Program Serving the Elderly as Well as the Young

Kiwanis has a mission to “Serve the Children of the World.” Many of us will, through aging, reach a “Big Kid” phase in our lives when we, again, become child-like in our needs. Based on the results of a Community Needs Assessment we identified several areas where seniors in our club's service area needed assistance with routine matters and would appreciate the presence of another human being. Kiwanis Assistance Resources for Elderly Services (KARES) is a program that focuses on those needs of the elderly.

During the nearly four full years that KARES has become a service project of the Tellico Village Kiwanis Club, quite an array of different services have been provided to seniors and elderly in Loudon County, TN. Here is a sampling of these services:

- Spending quality time with Alzheimer patients on a bi-weekly basis going for a drive and maybe having a “cheeseburger.”
- Making weekly phone calls to elderly shut-ins and visiting once a month.
- Building/fixing ramps for home wheelchair purposes.
- Hosting our fourth annual pancake luncheon at the Loudon County Senior Center serving 60-70 seniors.
- Providing transportation services for those who need to get to doctors appointments.
- Helping elderly couples with small things like changing a ceiling light bulb or helping a widow take down Christmas decorations.
- Arranging for pick-up of Alzheimer patient to get to a wellness center.
- Providing numerous pieces of maintenance advice on things such as carpet stretching/cleaning, repair of gas-powered tools, replacing a heat pump, repairs to heating ducts, gutter cleaning, chimney cleaning and so on. Most of these requests come through our answering service.
- Staying three nights with a husband with balance problems while the wife could attend a very special family event.
- Visiting assisted-living places on a once a month basis, plus providing a special quarterly

luncheon program.

What is next? As the Kiwanis Club begins its fifth year, new services are being added as we plan on supporting a Tellico Village Property Owners Association (STAY in Tellico Village) program. The Kiwanis Club has financially supported the early printing cost of the information guide available at the Library. Kiwanis is also supporting the Health EXPO as a participant. We hope our involvement will help leverage the further awareness of Kiwanis KARES within our service area.

As we rollout the various KARES services, Kiwanis will play an important role in the implementation and execution of a transportation program and will lead in caregiver care and social interactions. Eventually, home maintenance and housekeeping will be added as we work in cooperation with other “service providing groups” and our own Community Services Committee.
