Street Restoration in Coyatee/Tommotley Neighborhoods Begins Sept. 13

Southern Construction Group will begin work in Coyatee and Tommotley neighborhoods on the street restoration project on Friday, Sept. 13

According to Southern Construction Group:

There will be traffic control personal on site. We will be making one way streets where possible. All emergency vehicles will have access 24 hours a day 7 days a week. We will have traffic control at cul-de-sacs where one way is not possible.

Do not walk or drive on treated streets. It will track on driveways, sidewalks and carpet. Streets will be closed for up to 24 hours.

We will have parking available if you wish to take your car out of closed areas. Southern Construction will be available with one-hour notice to take you to and from your home and car. Please limit your travel.

Dates may change according to weather.

We ask for your cooperation and patience, and ask you to limit your travel during restoration. Streets may be closed to two lane traffic for up to 24 hours after restoration.

Helpful Hints

- Notify landscapers, trash pickup, other construction crews, or any outside service.
- Dry time may take up to 24 hours.
- If walked on before having time to cure, sealant will track on sidewalks, carpet, hardwood floors, tile or inside of cars and SOUTHERN CONSTRUCTION will not be responsible.
- There will be a distinct harmless odor.
- Please shut down all sprinkler systems.
- If there is a chance of rain, high winds, or a late start due to traffic

SOUTHERN CONSTRUCTION may cut back area or push the project back a day or more.
