Street Restoration in Coyatee/Tommotley Neighborhoods Begins Sept. 13

Southern Construction will be available with one-hour notice to take you to and from your home and car. Please limit your travel. For transportation to/from the Wellness Center, call 423-333-6998. To avoid morning traffic the mornings prior to construction, it would be appreciated if residents would park their cars at the Wellness Center the night before.

- Dry time may take up to 24 hours.

- There will be a distinct harmless odor.
- Please shut down all sprinkler systems.
- If there is a chance of rain, high winds, or a late start due to traffic

We will hike to Break Bluff which offers a beautiful view of the river gorge. Hiking sticks are strongly recommended to maneuver the difficult rocky areas.
