## **General Manager's Report for September 2013**

### **Board election update**

Three Tellico Village residents have declared their intention to run for the three available seats in this year's Board of Directors election. The three seats available are currently held by Bob Coates, Joe Marlette and Cap Purvis.

Declaring their candidacy and submitting their application packet are those same three Villagers: Bob Coates, Joe Marlette and Cap Purvis. The Board determined at their September meeting that an election is not necessary this year in accordance with the restated By-Laws. Article IV Sec. (E) of the restated By-Laws allows the Board to seat candidates by acclamation if the number of candidates equals the number of seats available. These three gentlemen will begin their new three-year terms at the December Board meeting.

### **Committee seats need volunteers**

The POA is still accepting applications for volunteers to fill seats on several of the advisory committees. If you are interested in serving the community by sitting on one of the committees, application packets are available at the POA administrative building.

Applications will be accepted until Oct. 1. After that date, managers will schedule meetings with applicants to put the best folks on the committee that matches their expertise and fills a need for the POA. The Board of Directors will approve and install new committee members at the December Board meeting.

### **Budget meetings**

The POA budget process gets rolling over the next few weeks. Parker Owen, Finance Director, has set up a schedule of meetings to help get us to the finish line and approve a budget at our November Board meeting. Throughout the process, the departments will review their budgets with the Finance Advisory Committee and Board Members.

Some progress has already happened as the department managers have received budget guidelines and budget model worksheets from the Finance Director. Managers submitted responses and met with the Finance Director in August and early September.

- Driving time: 1.5 hours

This hike is in a section of the Obed Scenic River within the Obed and Emory River Gorges. The first 2.5 miles to Alley Ford is rated moderate and the final 2.5 miles is difficult as you find yourself hiking down into the Obed basin where there are rocky and steep stairs and rocks to climb over. We will hike to Break Bluff which offers a beautiful view of the river gorge. Hiking sticks are strongly recommended to maneuver the difficult rocky areas. Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Bring water and a trail lunch. ### **Waste Connections Rate Change**
