Tellico Villagers Can Now Vote for 2014 Bliss Award

Tellico Village is a finalist for the 2014 Bliss Award given by Real Estate Scorecard.com (RES), and community residents can influence the outcome. RES has issued a challenge to the contenders and asked residents to vote for their communities online at RealEstateScorecard.com. Resident votes, in conjunction with the community analysis done by RES representatives, will determine the final award winners.

Tellico Village won the 2013 Bliss Award as the Best Community in Tennessee. The award is given, in part, to communities whose residents express the greatest satisfaction with the location, lifestyle, amenities and management of their communities.

Real Estate Scorecard is an industry leader in online real estate reviews, providing in depth information about the most popular master planned communities in Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Tennessee. Bliss Award winners benefit from an extensive national public relations campaign reaching print, electronic and online media outlets.

The 2013 award provided a valuable addition to the newly launched Tellico Village marketing/communications program and resulted in numerous leads and visits from prospective residents. Villagers can play a major role in helping the 2014 campaign with their Bliss Award vote.

Below is information on how and where you can vote for Tellico Village as the best place to live. As part of the process, you will be asked to enter your email address to verify property ownership status. You need not to worry about privacy issues.

According to Margie Casey at RealEstateScorecard.com, "These email addresses are not being added to our marketing database and will not be shared with any third party."

She adds, "There are the only two reasons RES might possibly need to contact a Bliss Award voter:

1. If we can't verify the property owner's name with public records to validate their vote. We may write the individual asking if there is another name on file in public records.
2. If we receive duplicate votes from one legal address. We will only count one 2014 Bliss Award vote per legal address. We may inform a property owner if we see duplicate address submissions."

Voting Rules

- Submissions will only be accepted from property owners of record. RealEstateScorecard.com has a cross check system in place to preserve the integrity of the votes.

- Property owners are to submit their vote online at RealEstateScorecard.com on any page of the website. **To quickly vote, click the gold medallion to the right and go to the website.**

- Submission deadline is Friday, Dec. 20, 2013. Voting will be closed Saturday, Dec. 21. Bliss Award winners will receive national recognition and the tangible award.

STAYinTV Home Maintenance Program in Full Action

The Home Maintenance Program from STAYinTN has been helping Tellico Village residents get some simple home repair work completed in a very economical way. Home Maintenance volunteers—about 30 now—perform a variety of minor maintenance jobs that can be accomplished in one or two hours, such as a fixing a leaky faucet, stopping a smoke detector beeping, fixing an electrical problem, or replacing a door lock, as examples. While bigger jobs are out of their scope, they developed a list of service providers they can discuss with the home owner to do the work. They do not accept payment for their labor; however, they do accept and appreciate a donation to continue supporting the work of STAYinTV. The homeowner pays the cost of purchased materials; and if the handyman has to drive outside the Village to obtain the parts, there is a \$5.00 driving fee to the volunteer.

The “Talk is Cheap” Tour features some of East Tennessee’s most beloved and renowned storytellers and guarantees to be a night full of laughter and fun. Each storyteller will take the stage and share a personal tale or two. At the end of the show audience members will have the opportunity to ask questions and learn more about these Appalachian treasures.

Jim Claborn is an accomplished storyteller and a favorite at the Museum of Appalachia, Morristown Crocket Museum and other venues across East Tennessee. Often times when speaking in public, he is “Davy Crockett” in his buckskins or dressed in his mountain man garb with a trusty musket in hand. Jim is a beloved teacher at All Saints School in Morristown. He is also a writer for the Morristown Citizen-Tribune.

Bill Landry has been the voice, host, narrator and co-producer of *The Heartland Series* since it was conceived on WBIR TV Channel 10 in 1984 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the founding of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. Since it began, over 1,400 short features have aired, including over 150 half-hour specials.

The Heartland Series celebrates

Appalachian people, land and culture of the entire region. Bill has collected numerous stories from his travels for the tales of the Heartland series and will tell many of these hilarious stories on Dec. 14.

Elizabeth Rose has thrilled children and adults alike with her storytelling in classrooms, festivals and conferences across the country. She shares stories woven with wit, humor and expressive enthusiasm. She is truly captivating in voice and presentation.

Sam Venable is a humor columnist for the *Knoxville News Sentinel* and a native of Knoxville. He graduated from the University of Tennessee with a degree in journalism and minor in forestry and wildlife management. Before becoming a humor columnist, Sam served as the *News Sentinel’s* outdoors editor for 16 years. Winner of more than three dozen national and regional writing awards, Sam is widely published outside the newspaper field. His latest book, *Someday I May Find Honest Work: A Newspaper Humorist’s Life*, is a collection of tales where Sam chronicles life and all the strange and absurd things that go with it.
