Winter Golf in Tellico Village

Just some things to think about before we tee it up (no matter what temperature we choose):

Please be sure to dress appropriately. Have your multi layers on. Some of the new high-tech clothing is not only warm, but lightweight and available in our pro shops.

Be sure to have something with you to keep your hands warm. There are gloves available that can be used while playing and others to keep you warm between shots.

Something to keep in mind when playing during the months when our Bermuda fairways are dormant: The divots you make will not grow back until the spring! It's even more important to fill these in with the sand provided on your cart. After all, there's nothing more upsetting than having to play out of someone else's divot!

Yes, the bent grass greens have not gone dormant; but remember the grass is not growing as fast during cold weather as during either spring or summer, so it's even more important to repair that ball mark.

Playing those shots that may be a chip in the spring or summer can now become a "Texas Wedge" on dormant Bermuda. Given the fact that we don't record, for handicap purposes, our scores in January and February, now is the time to attempt some of those shots we've been thinking about. Work on the half wedge, the low trajectory, the new stance. We can make the best use of the "off season." And don't forget to attend the free clinics that our great pro staff members are giving during the winter season.

On another note, the 2014 POA budget includes funding for a pavilion and additional paved parking at Toqua as well as money for much-needed improvements to some of the bunkers.

She adds, "There are the only two reasons RES might possibly need to contact a Bliss Award voter:

1. If we can't verify the property owner's name with public records to validate their vote. We may write the individual asking if there is

another name on file in public records.

2. If we receive duplicate votes from one legal address. We will only count one 2014 Bliss Award vote per legal address. We may inform a property owner if we see duplicate address submissions."

Voting Rules

- Submissions will only be accepted from property owners of record. RealEstateScorecard.com has a crosscheck system in place to preserve the integrity of the votes.
- Property owners are to submit their vote online at RealEstateScorecard.com on any page of the website. **To quickly vote, click <http://realestatescorecard.com/node/add/property-owner-review> and go to the website.**
- Only one 2014 Bliss Award vote per property address will count.
- Property owners can choose to vote anonymously.
- Submission deadline is Friday, Dec. 20, 2013. Voting will be closed Saturday, Dec. 21.

STAYinTV Home Maintenance Program in Full Action

The Home Maintenance Program from STAYinTN has been helping Tellico Village residents get some simple home repair work completed in a very economical way. Home Maintenance volunteers—about 30 now—perform a variety of minor maintenance jobs that can be accomplished in one or two hours, such as a fixing a leaky faucet, stopping a smoke detector beeping, fixing an electrical problem, or replacing a door lock, as examples. While bigger jobs are out of their scope, they developed a list of service providers they can discuss with the home owner to do the work. They do not accept payment for their labor; however, they do accept and appreciate a donation to continue supporting the work of STAYinTV. The homeowner pays the cost of purchased materials; and if the handyman has to drive outside the Village to obtain the parts, there is a \$5.00 driving fee to the volunteer.
