Located in Big South Fork NRRA, this hike has a lot to offer, starting with the twin natural arches that we meet fairly early in the hike. We'll take time here for picture taking. The trail also takes us to a very rustic, but operational hostel; remains of a homestead and family cemetery dating to 1863; and finally to several very large rock overhangs. The trail is generally well maintained with just a small amount of rock climbing near the rock walls. There are a couple of steep stairs to navigate as well.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Bring water and a trail lunch. Carpooling is recommended, passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver to help cover gas, etc. Check out the website www.tvhikers.com.

Health and Services Expo April 11

The 3rd annual STAYinTV Health and Services Expo will be held at the Christian Life Center (CLC) of the Community Church at Tellico Village 9 a.m. Friday, April 11. STAYinTV sponsors this Expo to give residents an opportunity to meet some area health and service providers and members of local support groups. Most of them are listed in the STAYinTV Resource Guide. Many of them will have handouts available for guests to take home with them. Guests must register to take advantage of any of the screenings arranged for by Fort Loudoun Medical Center. These include postural screening for golfers, checking oxygen saturation/blood pressure/Spirometer, carotid artery screening, blood tests, and skin check 9-11:30 a.m.

All screenings are free except for the blood tests that will be available in the main room of the CLC. The test costs for each are: Blood Chemistry Profile \$20 with fasting for a recommended 10-12 hours for accurate results; Complete Blood Count \$15; Prostate Specific Antigen \$20; Thyroid Stimulating Hormone \$20; High Sensitivity C-Reactive Protein \$20; and Hemoglobin A1C \$20. Payment can be made with cash, check, or credit card.

Other vendors will offer vision and spinal screenings. For those guests who wish to have a hearing screening, their first stop should be to the testing room on the lower level to make an appointment. Guests can visit the other vendor displays and take advantage of other screenings until their appointment time.
