General Manager's Report

POA Re-Bids Insurance with Excellent Results

This year, your POA took on the task of rebidding our Association insurance. For the past several years, TIS Insurance has been our carrier, and we thought it would be a good time to reach out into the industry and see what else we could find.

Insurance rebid packages were received from three potential agencies, including the incumbent, TIS of Knoxville. The criteria for selection of the renewal agency were price, full coverage and customer service. The incumbent, TIS Insurance, was the low bidder overall, offered full coverage of our insurance needs using a combination of four carriers, and was hands-down the most professional, customer-oriented agency of the three.

Our overall rates are actually down about \$10,000 from last year due to decreases in Worker's Comp loss experience. All three agencies have been notified of our decision, and the insurance is bound and in force.

Kudos go out to Parker Owen for his hard work on getting this done and getting it done quickly with great results.

As a side note, this rebid did not involve employee health insurance.

We worked with the same audit team as last year from Coulter & Justus, PC. Verbal feedback from the auditors was very complimentary. They issued only the standard, required Auditor Communications Letter and did not issue an Internal Controls Communications Letter, because they found no weaknesses in our internal controls.

Many thanks go out to Parker Owen and the entire Finance Department team for their hard work on providing the detail needed to get through the audit with this high rating.

Because it is one of three or four of the best trails in the Park for viewing wildflowers. One can expect to see the floor of the Sinks covered with purple phlox. It is also one of the few places in the park where you can see shooting stars and bluebells. If the timing is correct, we may also see yellow lady slippers. It can be a very exciting wildflower hike. There is also a waterfall and the "Bat Cave."

The **Blessing of the Fleet** is a tradition that began centuries ago in Mediterranean fishing communities. The practice is predominantly Catholic and a blessing from the local priest was meant to ensure a safe and bountiful season. However, both the ancient Greeks and Romans held elaborate ceremonies when their ships were christened, not much different from our ship launches of today. Parties were held, toasts of wine to the honored deity, a blessing from the high priest, and water poured over the boat were the basic events of the ceremony. Any deviation from these events was considered a bad omen, with the result being a tragedy at sea. Poseidon, who was considered the God of the sea, as well as earthquakes and horses, was a favorite of the Greeks to ask for protection. The Romans preferred Neptune, who was also considered a God of the sea. Some Native Americans, who painted symbols or animals on their canoes, also held launch ceremonies consisting of feasts, prayer and blessings.

In the evening, robbers came into the Lion's Academy and orphanage in Kenya, Africa and shouted at the children, "be quiet, we have guns." The children were so frightened, they lay on the floor, waiting for the gunmen to leave. The robbers broke into the commissary and stole the children's food. Harriet Nkatha, the head mistress, had just stocked the food supply for the month, and the loss was about five hundred dollars, which was much more than they could afford. The local police said there was nothing they could do, but they should build a fence around the compound. But the compound around the Lion's Academy is large and a fence would cost thousands of dollars.



Harriet reached out to their angels in Tellico Village, Ruth and Paul Thornton who wired the money for the food to feed the children. Ruth and Paul then asked the Kiwanis Club of Tellico Village for help. Together, they raised enough to pay for the fence, which is shown in the picture. Ruth Thornton said "I don't know how Harriet does it; raising 48 orphaned children in a hostile environment, but she does. God bless her, and hopefully the children will now be safe from robbers."
