Village Golf Courses in Full Swing

Tellico Village golf courses are getting ready for prime time and there are a couple of tournaments coming up to test your game.

Memorial Day Beautification Tournament: Just around the corner is the Memorial Day Beautification Tournament, May 26 at Toqua. This tournament is a fundraiser for all three Beautification teams representing each Tellico Village golf course.

The format is a four-person team event called the Tennessee Scramble and each team must have at least one man and one woman. The fee is \$25 per person, which excludes green fees and carts. This is always a fun event and you can sign your team up at any of the three Pro Shops.

Senior Club Championship is on May 31 and June 1. This year it will be a 36-hole individual stroke play tournament with one gross winner in each flight and all other prizes are net. To be eligible to play you must be a property owner in Tellico Village and have a valid USGA handicap. Both days are at Tanasi and tee times will start at 8 a.m. The fee is \$20.

Beautification Teams: All three Beautification Teams are working on their plans for 2014. The Course Superintendents are encouraging each team to focus on lower maintenance gardens and one way to achieve this is by planting native plants. Many of the gardens don't have water available and depend on rain only for moisture. By planting native plants they will have a better chance of surviving. This look will also follow the naturalization theme that was started last year with the planting of tall grass throughout the courses.

You can find the Toqua Beautification team working to improve and maintain their existing gardens. They have some big projects coming up this year. They met with Chad Johnson who works for the POA and will be assisting his crew in landscaping the Toqua clubhouse and the new Toqua Pavilion.

Tanasi made a big change this spring—the nines were switched. This meant the tee box markers also needed to change. After researching the best and most economical way to change the markers it was finally decided to purchase tile, have the numbers etched on them and secure them to the existing markers. The Tanasi Beautification team used some of their dollars to pay for this project.

They are also adding decorative grasses around the restroom near #5 green. Another area where you will see added plantings is by the bell on #9. Look for some Encore Azaleas to add some height and color amongst the hostas and daylilies.

The team continues to maintain their existing gardens. One they are very proud of is the hillside area just before the tunnel on your way to holes #1 and #10. This area was completed last year and more plantings will be added. If you have played Kahite you can't help but notice the retaining wall and planting along #17 tee boxes. The wall is very attractive and stops dirt from washing onto the cart path. They also had enough block left over to add a wall along #11 tee box.

Already this year they have added a large bulletin board in the Kahite Pro Shop. It will be used by the leagues and Pro Shop to post golf events and activities. So you don't miss your tee time, a clock was also purchased by the team and is located on the front of the clubhouse.

They have plans to replace the railroad ties around all the drinking fountains with concrete block edging pavers and are looking into replacing the railroad tie steps at the driving range with concrete steps. Another project on their list is to paint and rejuvenate the restrooms on holes #5 and #15.

All three groups would love to have more volunteers to assist maintaining the gardens. More volunteers makes for less work for everyone so please consider joining one of the groups. Remember you don't have to live on the golf course to be on a team nor do you need to own a shovel or a rake. If anyone is interested, please leave your name at the Pro Shop of the course you want to join.

Pace of Play Decals: Just following a few simple steps can improve your pace of play. To help remind us, each cart will have a decal with strategies for how to improve pace of play. Hit and Sit, score at the next tee, watch everyone's ball and keep up with the group in front of you. If we all would just add these steps to our game, pace of play would improve.

Tellico Village Golf Course Updates

Winter Kill: It is no secret that we had a cold winter. Our golf courses are telling us just that from the amount of Winterkill they are experiencing. The worst areas are the areas surrounding the greens at Toqua and Tanasi, some of the tee boxes and the upper level driving range at Toqua. All these areas will require new sod. Kahite showed a little Winterkill and hopefully will not require new sod.

Toqua Clubhouse: The Toqua Clubhouse will be undergoing an exterior makeover with new paint and landscaping.

We are excited, and very fortunate to have landed one of the best Golf Course Architects in the business to help guide these efforts in Bill Bergin. Bill has put together an excellent plan and helped us solicit highly competitive bids from multiple professional contractors to complete this first phase of the bunker project. We have limited funds to work with on this first phase but are excited to announce that the bids are in and we will be able to impact twelve bunkers this spring. We hope to start work by the end of this month and will be finished by the Member-Guest week. This is a very exciting project that will help transform the Toqua Golf Course.

Toqua Pavilion: The pavilion is roughly on schedule to be completed for the Men's Member/Guest in mid June, weather permitting.

Toqua Wet Well: A few months ago a sinkhole was discovered near the Toqua wet well, which is the main source of water for the course. We are happy to announce the building has been secured to bedrock and the pump skid has been leveled. The pumps are fully operational and the repair is complete.

New Pro: The search continues for a new golf professional to replace Mark Wickenden.

Yellow Tees: There are still a few Yellow tees at Toqua that need to be built and hopefully after this busy spring season they can be addressed.

As you can see, all three courses are working hard to make our golfing experience more enjoyable. Please be patient during all the construction process. The end result will be worth waiting for.
