Tournament season is underway at Tellico Village, and our largest, highest-profile event of the year is just around the corner – our Men's Member-Guest. This year's event has a full field of 144 players (72 teams) competing in 12 flights, and is scheduled for June 18-21. The tournament format includes five 9-hole matches, with each team competing against all other teams in their flight.

In 2014, we are again blessed with very generous support of key sponsors allowing this event to continue to evolve and improve as the premier event in Tellico Village. Did You Know: Tennessee-One-Call System

Did you know that your Public Works department is a member of Tennessee-one-call system. That's the program also known as Call Before You Dig. What does that mean to you, the homeowner?

Anytime you have work done on your property, just call 1-800-351-1111, or call 811, and provide them with the information they ask for. Make sure that you tell them exactly where on your property you plan the work to take place, that way Public Works can mark our utilities for you. Other members of Tennessee-one-call, such as AT&T, or Charter will automatically be notified to do the same.

There is a three-day time frame that Public Works has to locate the utility lines unless it is an emergency, then it is a three-hour timeframe.

Color-coded paint will be used to mark the underground utilities: blue for water, green for sewer, red for electric, etc.

Hike Middle Prong Trail June 13

The Tellico Village Hiking Club will depart 8 a.m. Friday, June 13, from Chota Center, to hike:

- MIDDLE PRONG TRAIL TO INDIAN FLATS FALLS
- Distance: 8.2 miles
- Elevation Gain: 1,000 feet (gradual)
- Rating: Moderate
- Driving Time: 1.25 hours

The trail is one of the most beautiful sections of the Great Smoky National Park near Townsend and Tremont. The trail follows the rushing Middle Prong of the Little River, and features overlooks of waterfalls, cascades and rapids cut through a narrow gorge. This hike follows a wide old logging railroad bed up a gentle slope with 1,000 feet of gain. Indian Flats Falls are a strand of four falls on Indian Flats Prong. Since the hike is between 2,000 and 3,000 feet elevation, the temperature will be lower than in Tellico Village.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Bring water and a trail lunch. Carpooling is recommended, passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver to help cover gas, etc. Check out our website at www.tvhikers.com.

This out-and-back hike turns around at one of the prettiest destinations in the park. Gregory Bald is famous for its flame azaleas, large shrubs with beautiful orange-red clusters of flowers. We hope the hike coincides with maximum bloom when the Bald is alive with flame.

The trail to the Bald begins in the back of Cades Cove (we must drive the loop). It climbs steadily and unrelievedly uphill, with the last quarter mile being as steep as any trail in the park. The Bald is on the main spine of the Smokies, and you can feel the change in climate, so even on a warm day, bring a light jacket. You will need it after the exertion of the climb. As with any spectacular reward, this one takes effort. On the way down, you can congratulate yourself for seeing a special part of the park that only a hearty few can experience.

Home Maintenance Has New Partner

STAYinTV's Home Maintenance Program which began last July will soon celebrate its first year in operation. "This is a credit to the volunteerism in Tellico Village and the good work our handymen and their monthly captains," said Scott Mathot, program coordinator. "Our increasing activity shows that we have a very good service that is easy to use. As we are nearly doubling our number of service calls in the last few months (11 to 12 calls per month, and, trending upward), we are proud to announce we have a new partner in this effort: Sloan's Hardware Store will be a Program Sponsor for Home Maintenance. This includes the store in Tellico Village as well as the one in Vonore serving Monroe County and Kahite."



Sloan's Hardware is offering to sell needed materials for Home Maintenance Program at a 10% discount as well as provide relief from sales tax since we are a 501(c)3 non-profit organization. This gives our clients about a 20% discount on purchases for the needed maintenance parts or materials. The clients must reimburse the handyman for such purchases directly. The arrangement guides our handymen to buy the needed items at Sloan's whenever possible. It also provides Sloan's a visible way to provide civic support to the Tellico Village Community. STAYinTV will receive a new source of income to help pay for brochures, program expenses and support various administrative activities. Mathot said, "It's a 'win-win-win' kind of partnership!"

The Home Maintenance Program has about 30 volunteers supporting this effort. It has a Steering Group (led by the program coordinator) of six captains overseeing this activity. In due time, as we continue to grow our service within the Village, we will need additional volunteer handymen and captains. To volunteer for this effort, you may call the same answering service our clients call to request assistance (865-458-7084, or 423-884-2057 for Kahite). You simply need to leave a message with your name and phone number and we will call you back within 24 hours. We welcome Sloan's Hardware to our effort to bring minor maintenance assistance to those in Tellico Village that have difficulty with this kind of work. We believe it will help our Villagers to "stay" in their homes longer and age with dignity.

Best Courts in the United States

Are Tellico Village's new pickleball courts the best in the country? National Senior Olympics pickleball champion Mike Kitchens thinks so. "The new courts are wonderful," he said. "Absolutely the best of all the outdoor courts I've played on anywhere in the country."

Kitchens and other serious pickleball players competed recently in the first tournament to be held on the new courts. “The ball is clearly visible against the blue court and it’s easier to call the lines,” Kitchens explained. “The surface is consistent, so you can predict the way the ball will bounce and the game moves more quickly because the balls don’t roll away from you.”

John Winslow, the pickleball club’s Tournament Chairman, is delighted with the courts for a different reason. “The expanded number of courts—from four at the Chota Center to eight at the Wellness Center—gives us more flexibility and accommodates a larger group of players for our tournaments,” he said.

The first of two major pickleball tournaments held annually at Tellico Village took place Friday, June 6, through Sunday, June 8. Known as the Tellico Village Skill-Based Tournament (open to Tellico Village pickleball club members only) it includes competition in singles, doubles and mixed doubles. Matches are divided into two age brackets and, within each bracket, five skill levels. Winslow observed happily, “The fact that the courts are now part of the Wellness Center means they are easily accessible for members of the community to come over and view our events.”
