2014 Honor Awards Nomination Forms Now Available

You know who they are - how about telling us!

The 2014 Honor Awards Committee needs your help in identifying Tellico Village volunteers worthy of recognition. "We are pleased to represent POA in what is a community effort to thank and honor those whose volunteer activities contribute immeasurably to the well being not only of Tellico Village, but of the surrounding communities as well," said Lloyd Donnelly, 2014 Awards Chair.

Other committee members are Dan Cowser, Rusty Hart, and Linda Kaump. The committee is responsible for reviewing all nominations and completing follow-up information as needed, but they need your nominations by the Sept. 12 deadline to identify those exceptional individuals who deserve recognition for their efforts. An appreciation banquet has been scheduled for Nov. 14, where the nominees and winners will be honored.

The award categories are as follows:

Community Service Award (Service Outside Tellico Village)

Recognizes highly significant volunteer contributions by a Villager or a Village group to Tennessee communities outside Tellico Village, especially those in Loudon County and Monroe County. Recognizes devoted and effective voluntary service to social, recreational, environmental, management, and service-related programs within these communities.

Distinguished Service Award (Service inside Tellico Village)

Recognizes highly significant volunteer contributions by a Villager or a Village group to Tellico Village. These contributions should be so noteworthy as to have a major effect on: the general health, welfare and/or enjoyment of the Village; or the quality of life in the Village; or the fulfillment of a major need in the Village.

Government Service Award

Recognizes a Villager who has contributed significantly to the well-being of surrounding communities by being involved in their public relations, government affairs, international development or commerce activities, or their business and civic /governmental organizations. This involvement should have inspired respect for, better relations with, and, a greater appreciation of the Village.

Education Service Award

Recognizes a Villager who has contributed to the local school systems in a way that has significantly enhanced the learning experience of either local youth or local adults.

Outstanding Youth Award

Recognizes a Village youth, 21 years or younger, whose volunteer accomplishments significantly exceed the norm of expectations; whose efforts and services are a credit to the Village, reflect the spirit of caring, and are a good example for other youths. The recipient should have demonstrated leadership ability, initiative, and, responsibility.

Outstanding Individual Award

Recognizes a Villager, over 21 years of age, whose volunteer accomplishments significantly exceed the norm of expectations; whose efforts and services are a credit to the Village, reflect the spirit of caring, and are a good example for their neighbors. The recipient should have demonstrated leadership ability, initiative, and, responsibility.

The committee will entertain nominations to recognize individuals who do not fall into any of these categories, so don't worry about trying to make the individual fit the award description.

Honor Award nomination forms are available at the POA office, Chota Recreation Center, The Wellness Center, Yacht Club, Tanasi, Toqua and Kahite clubhouses, and The Public Library at Tellico Village.

Note: Honor Awards are for Villagers only. To recognize an employee, use Above and Beyond forms available in Village facilities and online. Village residents who are also employees may be nominated for an Above and Beyond Award if the activity for recognition is part of their job.

Your iPad Tip of the Week

How to create an iPad keyboard shortcut.

If you find yourself typing a common phrase or sentence over and over and you're thinking, there's got to be a better way... You're in luck! You can use two and three letter abbreviations for most anything you want. For example, your email address. By typing "eml" on the screen, autocorrect will display your full email address. "phn" may display your (865) 555-1212. Even websites, "ws" displays www.yourfavorite.com. When you type in your keyboard shortcut, you will see the suggested autocorrect of your phrase. Then tap the spacebar to use it.

Let's get started:

- From the Home Screen, Tap Settings > General > Keyboard > then look for "Add New Shortcut..." > enter your email address in the "phrase" box. Enter your abbreviation in the "shortcut" box such as "eml" and then tap SAVE.
- Click the Home button, tap on the Notes App and let's see if it works. Tap anywhere on the Notes body to pull up the keyboard, then type your shortcut and you should see it automatically suggested in a bubble.
- Now what if you want to delete or change your shortcuts? From the Home Screen, Tap Settings > General > Keyboard. Tap "Edit" located on the top, right corner.
- Next tap the red circle on the shortcut abbreviation you want to delete and then Tap "Delete". When you're finished, Tap "Done" up in the top, right corner and Click the Home button to leave Settings and returns you to your Home Screen.

This works in Mail, Messages, Pages, Safari, and third party Apps too.

First Friday for Local Authors Sept. 5

John Wylie Forcum, the next author in The Public Library at Tellico Village's *First Fridays for Local Authors* Series, will be at the Library 10 a.m.-noon Friday, Sept. 5. Mr. Forcum will meet and talk one on one about his book and writing in general. Mr. Forcum's book, "The Company of Girls, 1862-1865," is written in honor of his mother, Golly Evans Forcum, and his grandmother, Golly Cunyngnam Evans. Both his mother and grandmother lived on a farm along the Tennessee River near Old Washington in Rhea County, Tennessee. They were strong, independent, Southern women living during the Civil War. This historical fiction is based on records and events during the years of the Civil War and recounts the tales of the women left behind to endure the occupation of the Tennessee River Valley by Union forces. These brave women formed a women's auxiliary, the Rhea County Spartans, which was comprised of the women and female family members left behind when the men enlisted in the five Confederate companies of Rhea County. These brave women worked to support those companies and the home front during the Civil War years. The Spartan activities resulted in about 18 arrests and transport downriver to Union Headquarters in Chattanooga. This book is dedicated to their works to support their soldiers and morale on the home front and for the war effort in East Tennessee. Mr. Forcum resides in Tellico Village with his wife, Claudia.
