Waste Connections Update

According to Waste Connections, residents will not be billed for any service beyond October. Residents who have paid for service beyond October will automatically receive a refund from Waste Connections without the need to contact their billing department to request it. Waste Connections advises that automatic processing of refunds may take approximately 6 to 10 weeks after termination of service. If you have questions about the status of your Waste Connections bill or any refund due, call them directly at 865-458-6217.

- Waste Connections' final day of service will be Friday, Oct. 31.
- Starting on Oct. 27, homeowners are to set out their trash and recyclables on the normal day they always have, they are to leave the containers at the curb, and sometime that same day another truck will come by and pick up and remove the Waste Connections cans and bins.

This hike is part of the Knoxville Urban Wilderness trail system. The hike will begin with a docent talk about Ijams and the native area. The hike also includes Meade's Quarry which supplied Ross Marble for many buildings in Washington, DC.

Bring snack/water for the trail and a lunch for after the hike. Hiking boots and poles are suggested. Directions, parking, etc., to be provided the morning of the hike.

Hike the East Lakeshore Trail Oct. 21

Join us on Oct. 21 when we hike 2.5 miles of the Jackson Bend Branch of East Lakeshore Trail. Come along and enjoy the Fall Foliage on a trail that showcases a variety of landscapes and scenic views. We will gather at the Poplar Springs Boat Ramp parking lot at 9 a.m. where we will car pool to the trail head. Library Hosts Lectures Oct. 21 and 28

As part of Membership Month in October the FOTVL Education Committee has added two more lectures as part of the continuing Doug Christman Third Tuesday Lecture Series at The Public Library at Tellico Village.

On Tuesday, Oct. 21, local historian David Flanagan will be presenting the Murder of Emmett Till. The murder of 14 year-old Emmett Till and the ensuing trial of the perpetrators shocked the nation and provided a spark for the Civil Rights Movement in the 1950s. This lecture will cover the details of Till's murder and the trial that followed as well as the profound effect the entire episode had on the nation. Shocking and provocative, this lecture should not be missed. Suggested reading: "Getting Away With Murder: The True Story of the Emmett Till Case" by Chris Crowe; "Eyes on the Prize: America's Civil Rights Years, 1954-1965," by Juan Williams; and "A Death in the Delta: The Story of Emmett Till," by Stephen J Whitfield.

On Tuesday, Oct. 28, Dewaine Speaks will present a lecture on Weston Fulton, an inventor from around the Knoxville area who was called the "Edison of the South". The Norden bombsite that helped win WWII had a bellows inside which was invented by Fulton. Mr. Speaks is a humorous speaker and will talk about several of Fulton's inventions of bellows which spread to the wind. Who knew bellows could billow?

Hike Angel Falls Overlook Oct. 22

The Tellico Village Hiking Club will depart 8 a.m. Wednesday, Oct. 22, from Chota Center, to hike:

- ANGEL FALLS OVERLOOK
- Distance: 6.5 miles
- Elevation Gain: Approximately 500 feet
- Rating: Moderate
- Driving Time: 2 hours

This trail is in the Big South Fork Recreational Area. It is one of the most scenic in the Big South Fork, with passages along rock faces and through boulders, past cascades, over footbridges, climbing to a dramatic finish. The first part of the hike is relatively easy and provides very scenic views of the woods, river and rock formations. At about 2.2 miles the trail leaves the river and begins the ascent to the overlook. This is the only strenuous part of the hike as the trail climbs about 300 feet in about .6 of a mile through switchbacks and rock steps and between boulders. At the top of the bluff the trail levels for the next .2 miles to the overlook. Note that this is not a waterfall but a scenic overlook.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Bring water and a trail lunch. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Carpooling is recommended, passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver to help cover gas, etc. For more information, go to www.TVHikers.com.

“Our Southern Highlanders” is a classic tale of life in the Appalachian Mountains that was first published in 1913 and revised in 1922. Inspired by the years Horace Kephart spent among the inhabitants of the remote Hazel Creek region of the Great Smoky Mountains, the book is one of the earliest realistic portrayals of life in the rural Appalachian Mountains and among the first serious analyses of Appalachian culture. Kephart was enthralled by the mountains and culture and was very influential in the movement to create the Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

This trail is a pleasant hiking experience winding along the shoreline of Power line Cove and the main channel of Tellico. We will start with the Davis Ferry Trail to WindRiver and back – 3.6 miles. Your iPad Tip of the Week

With the fanfare of iOS 8, we now have an improved keyboard feature called "QuickType"! If you have not updated to iOS8, now with the release of 8.0.2, it's time.

Let's open "Notes" and look at this enhancement in typing. First you will notice the bar above the keyboard. As you begin typing your message, you will notice that predictive suggestions appear and you just tap to select the word you want. This is especially handy when texting. "QuickType" is adaptive and will learn what words you want with regular use. Also, this does not replace auto-correct but work with it, and you can even close "QuickType" to go back to the look of iOS 7.

Simply drag down the QuickType bar to minimize it and later you can open it again by dragging up on the little handle above the "Y" key. Now if you want it gone completely, Tap Settings> General> Keyboard> Predictive, and turn Toggle "OFF."

Next, if you misspelled a word, predictive will highlight the correctly spelled word in the middle of the bar, and if you tap the spacebar, it will replace the misspelled word with that one.

Now if you prefer your spelling, then tap the word in quotes to the left. You will notice it's still underlined in red, by tapping on the word, you will still get some suggestions as before.

Lastly, the Double tap of the spacebar will still insert your period to end your sentence.
