



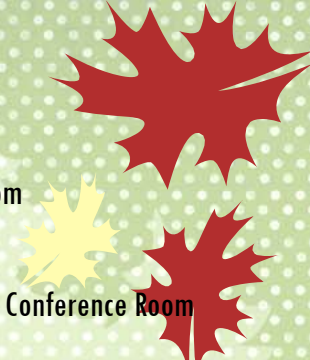

Some Other Stuff You Need to Know...

Your iPad Tip of the Week

In the last tip, I spoke about “Quicktype” and how it works with auto-correct. Well, this week I want to share with you how we can easily edit with “Quicktype.”

- I would like for you to open “Notes” app.
- Then tap the “create new” icon located in the top – right corner.
- Next, please type this short sentence... ‘Tellico village is a great place to live.’ The first thing I want to do is capitalize the “V” in village. So let’s double-tap on the word “village.” You should see just the word selected with the blue drag handles on each end of the word.
- Now tap the “shift key” and in the “Quicktype bar” you should find “Village.” Tap it.
- Next, let’s make the word “great” in all caps. Again, double-tap the word “great” and then, double-tap the “shift key.” Tap “GREAT” from the “Quicktype bar” to select and replace it with all caps.
- To unlock the “shift key,” just tap it again. And there you have it. No more moving the curser or deleting words to fix a small spelling error in the middle of a sentence.

Hike Cooper Road/Hatcher Mountain Nov. 7

The Tellico Village Hiking Club will depart 8 a.m. Friday, Nov. 7, to hike:

- Distance: 11.6 miles

This trail begins at Abrams Creek Campground. Cooper Road was once the main access to Cades Cove for settlers, farmers and loggers. In 2011 an EF4 tornado devastated much of the Hatcher Mtn. trail with a swath of destruction measuring up to a quarter of mile wide. It's interesting to see how Mother Nature brings the forest to life again after 3 years. Around the 9 mile mark the trail has a very steep ascent and very steep descent. There are approximately 6 stream crossings. Hiking poles are strongly recommended.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Bring water and a trail lunch. Carpooling is recommended, passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver to help cover gas, etc. For more information, go to www.TVHikers.com.

Adele grew up in Montague, Michigan. After graduating from high school she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in education from Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo, Michigan. She continued her education and received a Master of Arts degree in counseling as well as a CDA in early childhood development. Adele has spent many years working with children and parents. As a story teller she began telling her make-believe stories to her students, and 'Sammy the skunk' was one of their favorite characters. Although it wasn't a priority of hers to write stories, she finished part of the first story and set it aside. When she and her husband moved from Missouri to Tennessee, she found the cardboard box, now over forty years old, which contained the aged, colored papers of her first story about a little skunk named Sammy. It was at this time she realized she needed to complete the task she had begun many years ago. There are now four books published in a series about Sammy. Although there are illustrations in the books, the books are not the typical 'picture books' for children. The stories are meant to stimulate children's imaginations and to create images as they hear or read about a little skunk that enters the deep woods and meets many lovable little animals. As she started writing these stories, she began to focus on teaching Christian and character values based on the situations and circumstances in which the animals find themselves. After each story is a "Life Lesson." These lessons teach the attributes of God.

She and her husband now reside in Oliver Springs, TN. They have one son who is the founder and director of Kids4Truth International Clubs – Kids4truth.com. Courtesy Dock Guidelines

As a reminder:

- Daily use of courtesy docks are on a first come, first serve basis.
- Courtesy slips will not be reserved (daily or overnight) for any special events or occasions, such as Tiki Bar nights or other Yacht Club functions, holidays, etc. Their use will be on a first come, first serve basis.
- Only property owners can reserve a courtesy slip for overnight use (with the exception of the above); the fee is \$5 per night for a maximum of 3 nights; proof of current boat insurance must be provided before reserving the slip.
