Toys-for-Tots Drive Through Dec. 3

This marks the 18th year for the Tellico Village Woodworkers Club's "Toys-for-Tots" program. The program helps put toys under Christmas trees for many disadvantaged Loudon County children, the toys are distributed through the Loudon County Sheriff's Office.

Last year club members built and donated 355 wooden toys for the program. Over the last 15 years, club members have delivered to the County Sheriff's Office over 8,755 wooden toys. These toys have ranged from trucks and

Tellico Village residents have generously supported the program as well by donating purchased toys to the program. Last year over 375 purchased toys were given to the Sheriff's Office. In addition Village residents in 2013 made cash donations to Toys-for-Tots to help the Sheriff's office meet special gift needs, particularly for older children. Our residents came through generously, with donations of over \$1,500 to the program.

The newest addition to our Center for Lifelong Learning is the ability to offer classes in the Village that are diverse in topics, as well as convenient and very affordable. Cindy Solomon, Villager and Director of TVU, says that our extremely low tuition helps provide operational support and provides some funds for TVU development to purchase and share other programs that are used by these lifelong learning centers around the county. TVU, the most recent addition to the STAYinTV slate of programs, is an all-volunteer program that is the result of the work of a Curriculum Committee, volunteer instructors, and the Class Coordination Crew that ensures that each class session goes as planned.
