Searching the POA Website

You remember an article you read in the Tell-E-Gram—but you cannot remember when it

appeared! Do what the PR Department does: Go to www.TellicoVillagePOA.org, click on NEWS, click on TELL-E-GRAMS in the menu. Once you are on the repository of all Tell-E-Grams page, hit CTRL F (Control F) to open a FIND box. Type in one word to get the best results. For example, we were asked recently when the Toqua Pavilion ground breaking occurred. We typed in Toqua and hit NEXT until we came upon the April 1 issue. Typing in too many words or misspellings/different words may result in a lack of results. For Toqua, you could also just enter Toq (there are not many words that begin with that combination of letters). CTRL F works on any page.

Third Tuesday Lecture Jan. 20

On Tuesday, Jan. 20, as part of the continuing Doug Christman Third Tuesday Lecture Series, The Public Library at Tellico Village is proud to present the Secret City in photographs 9:30-10:30 a.m. Ed Westcott's photos have been seen around the world, and Ed has received numerous awards for his work. Ed's daughter and son-in-law, Don and Emily Hunnicutt, will present a narrative PowerPoint presentation reflecting some of the iconic photographs taken during this historic period.

Please join us for a step back in time to the once unknown city, Oak Ridge. In 1942 major decisions were being made to end WWII and stop the horrors of such a tragic war. That same year, Ed Westcott also had a major decision to make. Ed was employed with the Corp of Engineers in Nashville as a photographer. The Nashville office was closing and offered to transfer Ed to one of two ongoing projects. The choice was between a project in Alaska or a project in the Knoxville, TN, area. Even though there was no information given about the work to be performed, Ed didn't have to think very long to make the decision to move to Knoxville. Once he arrived in Knoxville in December 1942, he received his secret assignment to document construction of the newly formed Manhattan Engineering District Project. From 1942 through 1945, Ed was the only person authorized to possess a camera. His photography captured the creation of three manufacturing plants and processes; the birth of a city from once sparse farmland; as well as the daily lives of the 85,000 people that flocked to an unknown part of Tennessee to perform work for the war effort.
