Come share the exploits of Randle Patrick McMurphy, a charming rogue who contrives to serve a short sentence in an airy mental institution rather than in a prison. It only takes a couple of hours on Nurse Ratched's ward for McMurphy to realize this was a mistake.

In Dale Wasserman's adaptation of Ken Kesey's novel, McMurphy quickly takes over the ward and accomplishes what the medical profession has been unable to do for the past decade, including making a presumed deaf and dumb Native American Indian talk. He leads others out of introversion, stages a revolt and arranges for a rollicking midnight party that ends up having dramatic consequences.

One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest will be directed by Pam Russell and performances are scheduled for February 27 and two shows Feb. 28 (1:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.) at the Tellico Community Playhouse (304 Lakeside Plaza, Loudon, TN). Softball Players Wanted—Info Meeting March 3

The Tellico Men's Senior Softball League is scheduled to begin spring play, at the Loudon Municipal Park on Tuesday, March 24, and continue for 10 weeks. The slow-pitch, 7-inning league currently consists of five teams and they are looking for new players to fill anticipated vacancies. All new players will be placed on a team and guaranteed to play. The league is open to men 55 (by Dec. 31, 2015) and over.

Yearly cost of \$50 includes field rental, paid umpires, bats/balls, picnic and year end pizza party. Most players have not played ball since their youth but enjoy the camaraderie and a chance to keep active. There are some unique rules for senior softball that are intended to provide a margin of safety for the players. These include no contact rule for base running, ten players in the field, extra bases at first and home plate and no metal spikes.

Games are played on Tuesdays at 1 p.m., however team warm ups/batting practice begin about noon. In addition to the Tuesday games, there are optional batting practices on Thursdays at noon beginning March 5.

Diana Amann Cruze, the next author in The Public Library at Tellico Village's First Fridays for Local Authors Series, will be at the Library 10 a.m.-noon Friday, March 6.

Diana was born in Knoxville, TN, and has lived most of her life in this area except for five years in Rabat, Morocco, and three years in Pensacola, FL. She is married to Wayne Cruze, who is retired from the U.S. Navy. Her children, Kelly, Cheryl, and Brandon all live in Knoxville. Estella, 10 and Dolan, 6, her adorable grandchildren give her the greatest joy in her life. Writing has been a passion for most of Diana's life. Her poem, "Whirlpool," was published in New Millennium Writings. In 2012, she won first prize for her non-fiction piece, "Words and Music" from Knoxville Writers Guild where she is a member. Her book has been featured in the Knoxville News-Sentinel and Karn's Shopper News.

Diana's sales career began in the late '70s when she grew tired of office life and sexist bosses. Keebler Cookies offered her a temporary route position, covering for their vacationing sales reps. The cookie and snack position led to a job with a novelty company based in Roanoke, VA until a candy and tobacco company, Tobacco Sales, hired her. IDI (a grocery distributor, located in London, KY) kept her employed for three years and she finally chose industrial chemical sales as her last career. Starting her own company in 1994 afforded her even more freedom and frequent headaches. The variety of jobs took Diana to KY, West VA, VA, TN, and parts of NC. Although her jobs afforded her the freedom that she enjoyed as a child, her fear of heights made for many harrowing trips across mountainous regions. Mountains proved to be only one of many barriers to a woman in sales during the '70s, '80s, and '90s. Although most customers welcomed her, she did often hear sexist remarks. Probably the worst hurdle she faced was learning to make cold calls without shaking from nervousness. Diana plowed through the cold calls and summits, earning a nice living while enjoying freedom and fun with her customers.
