Knoxville, Tellico Village Featured in *Where to Retire* Magazine

On the cover of the March/April issue of *Where to Retire* magazine, Knoxville is touted as "Tennessee's Eastern Star." In the accompanying article, Tellico Villagers John and Terri Bordelon not only extol the benefits of residing near the city, but the advantages of living in Tellico Village.


Where to Retire magazine is one of the main information sources for soon-to-be and recently retired individuals. The Tellico Village Property Owners Association (TVPOA) marketing/communications program has an ongoing presence in the magazine with full page advertising in most every issue. With 200,000 circulation, the publication is a critical generator of leads with several thousand TVPOA program inquires coming from the magazine over the past two years.

Tellico Village's involvement in the Knoxville article started early last fall when almost simultaneous calls came into Beth Kuberka, TVPOA marketing manager and Louise Elliott, Tombras public relations executive, from the magazine requesting candidate couples to interview. Joe Bogardus, TVPOA marketing team member, found four couples who agreed to speak with the magazine, and their names were submitted.

In late October, John Bordelon notified the TVPOA marketing team that they had heard from the magazine and were going to be interviewed by a writer, Larry Bleiberg, who was assigned to the story. John and Terri had been on the list sent to the magazine. A few days later, Terri and John spent an hour and a half on the phone with Larry. The following week they met with a local professional photographer, hired by *Where to Retire*, for a half day of photography in Tellico Village and in Knoxville.

"It was a great experience," says John. "Terri and I love talking about the area, especially Tellico Village. We had a lot of fun doing it." At the time of the interview and photo session, John was president of New Villagers.

"Obtaining coverage in a major, nationally targeted publication such as *Where to Retire* magazine is key to our public relations program," commented John Cherry, TVPOA public relations manager. "It adds credibility to our brand."

Knoxville Symphony Orchestra and Lenoir City High School Choir in Concert March 22

Tellico Live! is proud to announce the Tellico Community Concert Committee's annual Spring Concert featuring the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra joined by the Lenoir City High School Choir on Sunday, March 22, at 4 p.m., at the Community Church of Tellico Village.

KSO's musical selections include a movement from Mozart's Symphony No. 35; Bizet's Suite No. 1 from the opera *Carmen*; show tunes and a Sousa March. KSO Resident Conductor James Fellenbaum conducts the Orchestra, joined by the Lenoir City High School Choir, conducted by Phillips Holloway. KSO Principal Bassoon player Aaron Apaza will perform the first movement of Mozart's Bassoon Concerto in B-flat Major. The Lenoir City High School Choir will perform in advance of the concert beginning at 3:25 and later in the program will join the KSO on stage for special selections.

Each spring the Concert Committee brings the KSO to Tellico Village. “We take pride in providing live orchestral music for the people of East Tennessee,” said Jennifer Harrell, KSO Director of Education & Community Partnerships. “The Knoxville Symphony Orchestra provides classical music for communities that do not have the opportunity to hear a live orchestral performance in their hometown.”

The Orchestra consists of 75 professional musicians and performs more than 250 programs throughout East
