## Long Range Planning Advisory Committee

One of the real strengths in the governance process for Tellico Village is the use of resident Advisory Committees for the POA operating departments. One of those is the Long Range Planning Advisory Committee (LRPAC) that works directly for the General Manager and the Board.

The LRPAC is responsible to develop and keep updated the Long Range Strategic Vision (LRSV) for Tellico Village. They also help the Board and the departments integrate the LRSV projects into the five-year plan and yearly budget.

Some of the duties of the LRPAC are as follows:

- Benchmark TV to the best similar communities in the country. This activity is completed and updated every five to eight years and takes six to nine months to complete. The purpose is to keep TV among the best communities in the country.
- Consult with the TV Marketing group to learn what visitors, buyers and Realtors like to have in communities such as TV and to put as many as possible into TV's LRSV, based on efficient use of our resources.
- Work with the operating departments and advisory committees to evaluate new and improved amenities and other attributes of TV to develop the LRSV.
- Help operating departments and advisory committees prioritize projects in the five-year and LRSV plans based on need, value to our marketing efforts and desirability by the property owners. Help to move projects from the LRSV to the five-year plan for implementation.
- Periodically review each department's five-year plan, business purpose and LRSV projects.
- Work with residents on privately funded POA projects in order to move them through the departments and the POA process for review.
- Assist operating departments with justification for new and improved amenities and other enhancements to TV based on benchmarking and marketing needs.
- Update the LRSV and projects every five to eight years.

The LRPAC performs a critical function to keep TV relevant and support quality growth in our community. It is interesting to sit in on some of their meetings (fourth Thursday of the month at 10 a.m.), and you may want to consider becoming a member of this interesting committee.

This is a pretty hike starting along a favorite Dayton area swimming creek with large boulders. We will pass an old mine and cross a 50 foot hiking bridge above Laurel Creek. At about 2 miles into the hike, we will go through and under boulders at a spot nicknamed, “fat man’s squeeze”. The hike will end at an 80 foot waterfall.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Bring water and a trail lunch.
