## Tellico Village Golf League Activities for 2015

The **18-Hole Ladies' Golf Association** is gearing up for a very active 2015 season.

**Opening Day** for this group was marked by a 9-hole scramble at Tanasi followed by a luncheon meeting at the Yacht Club on April 7. Throughout the year, this group of approximately 120 ladies will enjoy many golf events with different twists.

- The first of the “special tournaments” on the League’s calendar is the **Member-Member** tournament scheduled for May 16 and 17. The theme, “Girls Just Want to Have Fun,” will provide a festive theme for this annual two-day, two-woman team event.
- On June 30, the ladies will attempt to “**Beat the Pro.**” Jeff Harrington, pro assigned to this League, will be handicapped in some way to make this competition fair!
- **President’s Cup** is a three-day tournament held annually. It is scheduled for July 14, 15 and 16, each day on a different Village course. The first day of this event is stroke play, followed by two days of Match Play, with single elimination.
- “**Give Back Day**” is the designation given to an annual charity golf event. Last year and this year, funds were raised to benefit the Smoky Mountain Service Dogs. While this tournament is being run by the 18-Hole League, any Village lady resident with a USGA handicap is eligible to enter. Last year, this tournament raised enough money to sponsor a service dog which the members have appropriately named “Bogey.”
- The **Ladies’ Member-Guest** tournament is scheduled for Aug. 11. This is a one-day event, with an optional practice round on Aug. 10. The theme of this year’s festivities is “Got that Swing!” and is sure to include musical elements as well as competitive golf. It is open to all lady golfers in the Village with a USGA handicap.
- This League conducts one event which includes MEN! “**Bring A Man**” day is very popular and has had a “wait list” for players in recent years. A cookout following play is enjoyed while awards and other prizes are presented.
- This year’s **League Championship** is scheduled on consecutive Tuesdays, Aug. 18 and 25. This is a stroke play-event with prizes awarded for both low gross and low net and from both regular (green) and forward (yellow) tees.
- **Closing Day** is Oct. 27. Like Opening Day, this is a 9-hole scramble followed by a luncheon meeting. This is the culmination of a productive year of golf where trophies and awards are handed out to the winners of various events.

Membership in the 18-Hole League is open to any Tellico Village Property Owner who has a maximum USGA handicap of 36 at the Toqua Course.

Last fall, three new members were elected to the 2015 Board, Dave Prince, Ed Frandle, and Ron Coles. We also welcome Adam Jacob who replaced Jeff Harrington as our Golf Staff Professional. Personal scheduling conflicts for 2015 prompted Ken Moore to tender his resignation (remaining term of 2015 and 2016). The MGA Bylaws allow the Board to select a term replacement. Tom Feil was the highest non-elected vote recipient in 2014 and was asked to serve the remainder of Ken's term and has also accepted the role of Secretary for 2015.

After the success we experienced in recognizing the Player of the Year and Most Improved Player as they were established in 2014, we have chosen to continue that format for 2015. Player of the year was decided during the last match of the year between players at both ends of our handicap range. The weekly points that were awarded not only recognized the flight winners but also recognized individual low gross and low net scores. Most Improved Player of the year is determined by establishing a base during the players first six rounds played of the MGA season. Course scores are adjusted based on course differentials and the winner is determined based on highest percentage improved from the base score.

We are pleased that the 2014 MGA Board enacted an initiative to provide members an opportunity to have a competitive weekly game, vary playing partners, provide challenging weekly games, promote sportsmanship and joy of the game, and promote personal improvement in the challenging game of golf. We found that both Player of the Year and Most Improved Player were a part of this successful initiative.

You will recall in 2014 we fully embraced the Tee it Forward campaign by eliminating the prior MGA 90+ tee guideline. That guideline stated that a player could elect to play from a forward tee if a combination of their age and handicap totaled 90 or greater. We chose to allow every player to decide the tee box that they wished to play. You may recall that there were a few "issues" with this change but sportsmanship prevailed and the Tee it Forward initiative was accepted. We will continue the same Tee it Forward initiative in 2015.

The MGA Board closely followed Pace of Play in 2014 and is enacting additional initiatives to further improve Pace of Play for 2015. Before these initiatives are explained, take a moment and recall the number of Thursday rounds when you personally waited at the scorer's table for the last couple of groups to finish. The MGA has seen tremendous improvements in Pace of Play with typical rounds being played in 4 hours 15 minutes. We continue to find that there are a few golfers who will not follow proven Pace of Play methods (ready golf, cart management, keeping up with the group ahead, etc.). Pace of Play is nothing more than consideration for your fellow golfer. For our 2015 season we are enacting three (3) additional initiatives. First, all pregame announcements will be made 15 minutes prior to posted tee time. The matches will start at the posted time. We will not wait on late arrivals. Be considerate of your fellow golfers and be on time. Second, Thursday scorecards have posted time guidelines for each hole. We expect each group to follow these guidelines (we tested these "per hole" timed guidelines and found them to be very reasonable). And third, each team will have a "round completed" time posted next to their score. A round completed is when the scorecard is given to the scorer. The MGA Board recognizes that we all have other fun events to attend after golf. We ask that each of you follow pace of play guidelines and be prepared to turn in your scorecard within the goal of 4 hours and 15 minutes.

In 2015 we are making a change to the selection process for our team participating in the Tellico Lake Challenge. There will no longer be any automatic qualifiers including automatic MGA Board members. Our Tellico Lake Challenge Captain is Lynn Pinkerman, Co-Captain is Dave Prince, and they will be responsible for recommending team members in 2015. Their primary selection process will involve recommending golfers who have won events, placed high in overall point totals (both group points and individual points) and are showing gains in the Most Improved Golfer standings. The selected team will be presented to the Board and a final team will be selected.

We are attempting to make our MGA Member/Member Tournament a premier event for 2015. Overall winner awards have been increased, participation gifts have improved, and a Friday evening get together with a skill event has been planned. There are two events scheduled prior to the Member/Member Tournament where players can compete in the normal Thursday event with their Member/Member partner. Those are "Choose Your Partner"

### Lions Now Collecting Used Hearing Aids

The Tellico Village Lions Club has added a new item to their used collection program – hearing aids. They already collect used eyeglasses and cell phones. The eyeglasses are sent to a recycling center in Roanoke, VA, where they are classified, repaired as necessary and then shipped overseas for use by foreign Lions Clubs. Occasionally, exceptions are made and the glasses distributed domestically, as in the case of the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. The cell phones are also recycled and the proceeds of their sale used to buy calling cards for US servicepersons stationed overseas.

The hearing aids will be collected in the same repositories as the eyeglasses and phone – collection boxes in the clubhouses and the library. The donated aids should either be in their original contained or in a plastic baggy. Please insure that the batteries have been removed.

The collected aids will be given to the Hearing and Speech Foundation located in Maryville, TN. This organization has an extensive program of recycling aids for distribution to indigent citizens of East Tennessee. New hearing aids are extremely expensive and many low-income residents cannot afford them. Their subsequent inability to hear has an extremely serious effect on their quality of life as well as their ability to get and hold jobs. These recycled aids can have a huge impact on these individuals.
