Warm Season Bermudagrass on Village Golf Courses

As mentioned in the recent USGA Green Section Report for the Southeast Region published on May 7, Bermudagrass fairways have been slow to green-up following the extreme cold weather this winter.

The purpose of this update is to help provide some helpful insight on the impact extreme cold weather can have on warm season turf.

It is commonly thought that when Bermudagrass enters a dormant state, which occurs soon after a hard frost in the fall, that the turf is immune to injury or damage. This isn't true as what is below the ground (stolons, rhizomes and roots) is still very much alive. Extreme cold temperatures can cause injury or death of warm season turf.

“Winterkill” is a general term used to define areas of turf that did not survive extreme cold temperatures over the winter. But, more specifically, what conditions contribute to the potential winter damage to warm season turf?

- Extended periods of below freezing temperatures
- Shade, especially north facing slopes
- Poor drainage
- High traffic areas
- Insufficient or excessive moisture (leads to winter desiccation)
- Low mowing heights
- Immature turf, such as recently installed sod or areas that were sprigged the prior year

Considering the severity of this past winter, Tellico Village was fortunate to sustain very little Winterkill or winter injury compared to most other courses in our region. Most of the areas affected on our courses include compromised microclimates (shady, high traffic areas) around green surrounds, north facing slopes or poorly drained areas on certain fairways and areas that were sodded in 2014 (immature root structure). The turf management teams are in the process of re-sodding many areas around the greens and Mother Nature has helped our fairways green-up and recover.

STAYinTV launches volunteer grocery shopping program

STAYinTV, the Tellico Village aging-in-place initiative, is launching a program to provide grocery shopping for aging and homebound residents of the Village.

STAYinTV also operates programs to provide rides to Villagers who cannot drive temporarily or long-term, and to provide handyman services for minor home repairs.

Judy Leach, coordinator of the grocery program said STAY volunteers will shop for and deliver groceries directly to the kitchens of aging or incapacitated clients. The service will be available either on a short or long-term basis.

“Our service will help seniors who are no longer able to shop for and bring home their own groceries. It will help them stay in their homes longer,” Leach said.

Prospective clients for the service must pre-register and can call the office number (865-458-7084) to do so. There is a \$10 one-time registration fee and no charge for the service as long as it is done at Food Lion for the main Village or Sloan’s or Food City for the Kahite Neighborhood. There is a \$5 charge for shopping in Lenoir City or Loudon.

Clients will provide a signed check made out to the grocery store and the volunteer will write in the amount of the purchase at checkout. The receipt will be delivered with the groceries.

TV Lions Golf Outing – A SUCCESS

They came, they played, had a great time – the golfers who took part in the outing – for a great cause – helping the TV Lions continue to carry out their motto "We Serve."

The weather was most cooperative which added to the fun of the day. By the time it ended with lunch at 1:00 PM, the car was still sitting on Hole #3, the par 3 hole, inasmuch, as no one managed to get a hole-in-one. There were some close calls but the cars will be around a while. There were other notable shots – longest drive, closest to the pin for both genders that were most impressive.

At the end of the day two foursomes stood tall. The men's winners, Tom Breen, Kurt Szeluga, Frank Grote and John Fuchs and the mixed foursome winners, Bob Mezza, Linda Romero-Mezza and Linda and Jim Fuchs took home their prizes. These winning foursomes are pictured below, standing in order of their names from left to right.

From a financial perspective the event was also a great success. Currently it appears that the TV Lions will have earned over \$9,000, every cent of which will be used by the club to support the community and various vision programs conducted by the TV Lions. One example of the use of these funds is the Health Fair program at the Good Samaritan Center in Lenoir City. These fairs

are conducted monthly and provide blood pressure checks, glucose screening for potential diabetes and vision testing. Those whose vision test indicates a potential need for glasses are checked by an optometrist. If the individual needs glasses and they qualify under US poverty guidelines, the TV Lions provide the glasses free of charge. Thus far this year over 60 individuals have been given glasses at a cost of approximately \$6,000.

Raising the funds in this outing would not be possible without local businesses that provide sponsorship for the event. These vary in size from \$100 to \$1,000. In return for their sponsorships, the firms are given publicity, as shown in the two photos below (where size of the sign indicates level of support) and publicity throughout the year encouraging TV residents to support these businesses. The first step in this publicity campaign will be a flyer that will be distributed in June to all Village residents that list the names of each of the sponsors and encourages residents to patronize these businesses.
