TV Lions initiate a wellness project in Tellico Village

Over the 16 years of its existence, the TV Lions Club has raised and dispersed well over \$250,000 to a variety of charitable and service organizations in Tellico Village, Loudon County and East Tennessee. The bulk of the funds have been raised with the support of Village residents for the various Lions activities during the years. These include chili dinners, the Oktoberfest, and other fund raisers. The Lions have decided that it is now time to return more of this largess to the Village itself. This current donation is in the form of four exercise stations that have been purchased and being donated to the Village. They are being placed at strategic locations around the recently completed walking trail at the Wellness Center.

All of the stations have recently been assembled and installed. Benches for each station will be assembled over the next several weeks and similarly installed. Once the benches are in place, a ceremony will be held where the TV Lions turn over the stations to the POA.

According to Lion Bruce Johnson, the project manager for the Lions, these stations are unique in that they are designed by a firm that specializes in exercise equipment for seniors. As Lions Johnson stated "these are not for the 28 year old hard body fitness freak but rather for the 68 year old who is trying to maintain a measure of fitness befitting their health and overall physical condition." The stations can also be used for post surgery therapy.

Each station has an instruction placard mounted on it showing how the device is to be used. The number of repetitions and the frequency of use is at the discretion of the user.
