### **New Lighting to Improve Safety at Intersection**

Next year, the Tennessee Department of Transportation will install six streetlights to improve safety at the intersection of Highways 444 and 72 at the southern end of the Loudon County portion of Tellico Village. According to Pat Phillips of the Loudon County Economic Development Agency, preliminary design and environmental studies are ongoing. Travelers can expect to see construction and completion sometime in the summer of 2016. The project is funded using 80 percent federal funding and 20 percent local. The POA will keep Villagers updated as the project progresses.
