Loudon County Reverse 911

There is a free emergency notification system service to all citizens of Loudon County operated by the Loudon County E-911 Center along with the Loudon County Emergency Management/Homeland Security Agency who have teamed up to provide a notification system to provide emergency alerts to citizens in times of natural or man-made disasters. Any Loudon County citizen can sign up to receive alerts via: text message, voice mail, email, mobile phone, and traditional landline phones. Potential notifications can include weather alerts, missing children, law enforcement events, and hazardous material events. Two September Library Lectures on 9-11

Sept. 8 and 11 at the Public Library at Tellico Village will be devoted to lectures on the destruction of the twin towers. The 9:30 a.m. presentation on the 8th will be given by Don Edmands a retired Air Force Colonel. He will present **Attack on America**, a minute-by-minute track of the 9-11 attack taken from radar returns. His presentation will include the US defense posture prior to 9-11, post air defense changes and information about responses during the attack. The 9:30 a.m. presentation on Sept. 11 at the Public Library at Tellico Village will be given by Jim Rogers whose first civilian job after the service was in the IT department of a casualty insurance rating bureau on the 19th and 20th floors of the World Trade Center Tower 2. First you will see some photos of the construction of the World Trade Center (WTC) and the rooftop observation deck of Tower 2. A multimedia chronicle of the attack followed by helicopter photos obtained from the Port Authority police department and unpublished ground views. Hike Signal Mountain Sept. 11

The Tellico Village Hiking Club will depart 8 a.m. Friday, Sept. 11, from Chota Center, to hike:

- SIGNAL MOUNTAIN/MUSHROOM ROCK/SUCK CREEK ROAD – KEY SWAP
- Distance: 8.4 miles
- Elevation Gain: 400 ft. with various steep climbs
- Rating: Difficult
- Driving Time: 2 hours

This is an interesting hike with scenic overlooks of the Tennessee River Gorge, rock formations with the highlight being "mushroom rock" which truly looks like a huge rock mushroom, and two suspension bridges. It also has lots of rocks to walk through and over plus some steep climbs, some stairs. This is a key swap where one group will start at Signal Mountain and hike to a point on Suck Creek Road. The other group will begin at a point on Suck Creek Road and hike to Signal Mountain. Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike.
