One of the critical, if not the most critical, parts of playing good golf is putting. Players that effectively read greens, correctly evaluate green speed, and putt the ball on the intended line have more fun playing golf and win more often!

AimPoint Express is a teaching method employed by many top PGA Tour Professionals as well as countless amateur golfers. I am pleased to announce that Tellico Village Members and guests will have the opportunity to learn the AimPoint green reading method on Sept. 24 at **Toqua Golf Club**. This class is from 10 a.m.-noon and will be taught by Certified AimPoint Express Instructor and PGA Member Scott Sikorski. The class cost \$200 and space is very limited; please click the following link for additional information and call the Toqua Pro Shop to sign up.

As a personal note, I have personally gone through the Aimpoint Express Class, and let me tell you, it was AWESOME!! It is a great and simple system for reading greens and making putts. It's a fantastic way to take out the guess-work and have more confidence in your putting. Anyone at any playing level can learn these simple steps and start making putts. It is one of the best investments any golfer can make.

On Friday, Sept. 25, we will be hosting an Edel Golf putter, wedges, and iron fitting session. Scott Sikorski will conduct this as well as he is an Edel Master Fitter. Fitting will be on an appointment basis only, and it is FREE. If you want to be fitted like your favorite PGA or LPGA Tour pro, then this is a must. I had the pleasure of going through a putter fitting, and it has changed my life. It was an amazing experience to not only find out how poorly I aim my putts but also how to control my ball speed when putting. We have had over a dozen Cillagers step up to the process and add a Edel putter or wedges to their bag.

Auditions Sept. 21-23

The Tellico Community Players announce auditions for *It's A Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play* by Joe Landry at the Tellico Community Playhouse in the Patricia Smith Theatre 7-8:30 p.m. Monday, Sept. 21; Tuesday, Sept. 22; and Wednesday, Sept. 23.

The acting audition will consist of a cold reading of material provided. Since the play calls for multiple roles per actor, the actor may be asked to demonstrate his vocal ability to portray a variety of characters.

This show is a radio play, so the majority of the script will be delivered in readers' theatre fashion.

The cast size is flexible. This play has been written for as few as five characters, 3 men and 2 women, playing multiple roles. However, the number of roles and the character breakdown will be determined by the director at the time casting.

This production is unique to any that TCP has done in the past. It is a play within a play set on the 1946 studio sound stage of station WBFR in Manhattan. It is Christmas Eve and the evening's production is the timeless story *It's A Wonderful Life*. The beauty of this story unfolds in front of the live studio audience as the ensemble cast and crew of WBFR radio work their magic for all to see and hear.

The director's vision for the play has the audience stepping into a 1946 radio studio from the moment they enter the Playhouse door. Cast and crew alike will be role-playing and improvising as the WBFR radio personnel for the entire evening.

This play also has need of two Foley technicians who appear on stage and are responsible for executing the sound effects for this production. These individuals do not have speaking roles BUT are very vital to the success of this production.

This play also has need for a pianist who appears on stage and is responsible for playing the musical score that accompanies the radio production. Included in the score are musical transitions, bridges, jingles for advertisements, and theme tunes. The score is written for this play by Kevin Connors. This role is not a speaking role BUT it is very much a part of the success of this production as far as maintaining the sound of the 1946 world of radio.

Please plan to attend auditions on any or all of the dates listed. Bring your calendar so conflicts can be determined right away. Production dates for this play are Dec. 9-13. The music will be presented by DJ Lou and will feature music that most Villagers can relate to, music from the '50s to the '80s. Those who feel the urge can dance to their heart's content.

"Footloose in Tellico," a line dance club, will perform with a dance demonstration at 2 p.m.

In addition to viewing the vintage cars from the Vintage Vehicle Car Club and Corvettes from the Village Vettes Club, some of which are shown in the photo, attendees will also be able to vote on their favorite car, the owner of which will receive a prize.

Concurrently with the Fair, the GM Club will be manning the pumps at Mr. Gas. In addition to filling tanks they will also be washing windshields. They will be assisted by the Tellico Clowns in servicing the cars as well as entertaining those waiting in line. The owners of Mr. Gas donate a portion of the price of gas to United Way. Last year the gas service netted the campaign \$1,313.00. Come out and join in on the fun!
