PGA Senior League at Tellico Village: A New Way to Enjoy the Game

NOTE: Your PGA Professionals are always looking for new ways to grow the game of golf here in Tellico Village. Read below. If interested, contact Adam Jacob at Tanasi Pro Shop at 458-4707.

The PGA Senior League is a fun, team ordained, beginner league to expose Villagers to golf. Villagers will create their own team of 8 to 12 players or sign up individually to compete in a monthly 9-hole scramble format. We are looking to create eight teams and break those teams in two divisions. Each team will play the other teams in their division twice and will have a championship match in the final month. The season is seven months long, and each event will be played on a Saturday afternoon with a shotgun starting time

of 2 p.m. Following is an explanation about how participation will work, format, and time for when the matches will be held.

Team

A team is a collection of 8 to 12 players - men and women of any ability - who work together and compete against another team. Eight players will be required to play in each match.

Two divisions will be created with four teams in each division.

Every player on the team is encouraged to participate.

When the alternate player is not one of the two active players in his or her team's match, they can still play an integral role in the success of their team by reading putts, discussing strategy, tending the flag stick, and aiding pace-of-play. At no time should an alternate ever feel left out of the team's efforts!

Game

A game is played between two teams.

During the course of a game, three three-hole matches called "flags" are played. Two players from each team will play against each other.

The winner of the game is determined by the total number of points won within all matches.

The popular two-man scramble format encourages teamwork and problem solving. Its nurturing nature creates a fun environment where the negative effect of performance errors is minimized.

Each player will tee off at the beginning of each hole. The team then selects their best shot of the two, and each person plays again from the spot of the selected shot. Repeat this process until the ball is in the hole.

The team with the lowest score wins the hole.

Men will play from the Orange tees and Ladies from Yellow tees.

Flags

A "Flag" is a 3-hole segment of each match. Since each match is played over the course of 9 holes, there are three flags per match.

Whichever team wins the most holes within each flag (i.e. 3 holes-to-0 or 2 holes-to-1 hole), wins the corresponding flag.

Points

Each flag won by the team is worth one point. Each tied flag won by the team is worth a half point. The team with the most points at the end of the game wins. Since there are four matches each week, and each game is played for a maximum of three points, there are a maximum of 12 points total in each game.

Match Rules

Only players may call rules infractions. All rules infractions must be made/declared on the course and ruled upon prior to the start of the next hole.

1. **Shot Progression:** Both players on each team will tee off on every hole with the best shot selected and played. Continue this progression until the ball is holed and the hole completed.
2. Upon reaching the green, the ball selected for play shall always be lifted and placed at the selected ball's mark. No player shall roll or putt his/her ball to the marked location.
3. During the regular season, a player will be warned for improper movement of a ball on the green. Subsequent violations by the team in that match will result in a 1-stroke penalty.
4. Any intentional improper movement of a ball on the green to gain advantage will result in a 1-stroke penalty.
5. **Preferred Lies:** Players shall have the right to lift, clean and place their ball before each shot. There is never a penalty for inadvertently moving a ball in PGA Senior League Golf, with the exception of rule 1a.
6. Upon selecting the shot to be played, players shall mark the ball and then place the ball within one club-length of the mark, no closer to the hole, to play their next shots. A ball may be moved from the rough to the fairway if it is within the one-club distance. However, a ball may never be moved out of a sand bunker or on to the green.
7. No play is allowed from a marked hazard. No ball within a marked hazard can be played from within the hazard. Relief must be taken, with a 1-stroke penalty, if that ball is chosen to be played. Sand bunkers are not marked hazards.
8. Out of bounds is played as a lateral hazard during PGA Senior League Golf regular season games.
9. **Stroke Maximum:** Triple Bogey is the stroke maximum on a hole. No hole in PGA Senior League Golf can be won with a triple bogey.

We never heard of dragon boat racing until we retired. Our goal was to play golf. After a friend hit his drive 30 yards further, we begged his secret. “Dragon Boating.” So we gave it a try. Within five years, we grew stronger, have more stamina, and experienced the thrill of racing with some of the top competitive teams in the Southeast and beyond.

Dragon boating originated in China to celebrate dragons bringing prosperity, vitality and strength. Today it is among the fastest growing paddling sports popular with all ages, especially among women who are breast cancer survivors and seniors who enjoy the excitement of an active lifestyle. Festivals are held in communities around the world to bring people together in support of local charities like the Annual Mountain States Dragon Boat Festival in Johnson City, TN, that since 2006 raised well over \$750,000 for Mountain States Health Alliance.

We started dragon boating when we retired and have had some exciting times as paddlers, steerers, and coaches for those new to the sport or participating in festivals around the country.
