Village Billboards Debut on Area Roadways

Interstate travelers are starting to see the new Tellico Village billboard program directing them to the community.

The four board program debuted April 1 and will run for the remainder of 2016. This is the first sizeable billboard campaign in many years promoting the Village brand.

"With the opening of the Welcome Center late last year, we now have an accessible destination for potential residents to visit," explained Beth Kuberka, Tellico Village Property Owners Association (TVPOA) marketing manager. "It did not make sense to invest in billboard advertising before, because we did not have an easy to reach location to welcome visitors."

All the billboards are strategically positioned to capture travelers' attention as they approach key nearby intersections leading to the Village. One billboard is situated on I-75S/I-40W just past the Pellissippi Parkway. It is a former board once occupied by Tennova and Peyton Manning. Just after the Sweetwater exit on I-75N is where a second billboard is located. Out on I-40E just south of the Buttermilk Road exit is the location of a third billboard. The fourth billboard is on Route 321 just before Simpson Road in the plaza featuring the Subway Store.

In the coming months, the billboards program will be augmented with signs on the Tellico Parkway (Route 444) providing directions to the Welcome Center. Once this signage is in place, the original TVPOA marketing team signage plan will be complete. The first phase of the plan was executed in 2014 with the placement of TDOT signs on I-75 North and I-75 South prior to Exit 81 and at the exit's two ramps.

This hike will hopefully appeal to those who enjoy great vistas and/or Civil War history. Lookout Mountain was the scene of a significant Civil War battle on November 24, 1863. We stop for lunch at Point Park, which has a small museum, cannons, monuments, and signage documenting the battle. It also boasts fantastic vistas of Chattanooga.

Most of the trail is not difficult. However, there is a fair amount of uphill climbing on this hike. The trail is somewhat rocky, and there is a tall metal stairway to climb to enter Point Park. There is a modest entrance fee which will be collected if you go to the Visitor Center. It may be reduced or waived if you have a National Park pass.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended. Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike. Bring water and a trail lunch. Carpooling is recommended, passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to

The tournament committee conducted a survey last year to help assist in the process of continuously improving this wonderful event. Some of the changes recently enacted, include:

- The format for all five matches will be four-ball (2 person best ball)
- All play will be from the white markers, *except*:
 - Members may elect to play from the orange tees, provided at least 75% of their posted rounds are played from orange tees
 - Guests may elect to play from the orange tees if the combination of their handicap index and age is 90 or higher.
- The maximum handicap differential between partners is 15.0. Teams with greater differentials may still participate; however, handicaps will be based on the maximum allowable differential.
- Optional "Skins Game" within each flight

- Elimination of the extra "point" for winning the match, thereby making competition within the flights tighter

Past year participants are provided the first opportunity to sign up for this event. However, every year there have been numerous opportunities for NEW teams to sign up and participate in the event. Because there is a good probability that there will be more NEW teams applying than available slots, a lottery will be held to determine which teams get in the event and also determine the order of the waiting list. Based on prior year's experience the chance of "winning" this lottery and gaining entry into the Member-Guest will likely be as great as **50:50 or greater!**
