Triskidekaphobic or Friggatrisidekaphobic?

According to Wikipedia:

Triskaidekaphobia (from Greek *tris* meaning "3," *kai* meaning "and," *deka* meaning "10" and *phobia* meaning "fear" or "morbid fear") is fear of the number 13; it is a superstition and

related to a specific fear of Friday the 13th, called *paraskevidekatriaphobia* or *friggaatriskaidekaphobia*.

Did you know:

- Triskaidekaphobia is the scientific name for fear of the number 13 and Friggatriskaidekaphobia is a fear of Friday-the-13th
- There is a superstition, thought by some to derive from the Last Supper or a Norse myth, that having 13 people seated at a table results in the death of one of the diners, examples Loki, the trickster and Jesus
- Ancient Romans regarded the number 13 as a symbol of death, destruction and misfortune
- On Friday-the-13th October 1307, hundreds of the Knights Templar were arrested in France, possibly giving rise to the fear of a curse on that day
- According to Chaucer's *Canterbury Tales*, Friday has been considered an unlucky day to undertake journeys or begin new projects at least since the 14th century
- Napoleon and Herbert Hoover were triskaidekaphobic, with an abnormal fear of the number 13
- Butch Cassidy, notorious American train and bank robber, was born on Friday, April 13, 1866
- In Henry Sutherland Edwards' 1869 biography of Gioachino Rossini, who died on a Friday-the-13th "He [Rossini] was surrounded to the last by admiring friends; and if it be true that, like so many Italians, he regarded Fridays as an unlucky day and thirteen as an unlucky number, it is remarkable that on Friday 13th of November he passed away."
- The novel, *Friday, the Thirteenth*, published in 1907 by Thomas W. Lawson contributed to disseminating the superstition as an unscrupulous broker took advantage of the superstition to create a Wall Street panic on a Friday-the-13th
- Fidel Castro was born on Friday, August 13, 1926
- President Franklin D. Roosevelt apparently suffered from triskaidekaphobia. According to The Huffington Post, he refused to travel on the 13th day of any month and would not host a dinner party with 13 guests.
- In Paris, a "quatorzieme" is a professional 14th guest hired to join a party of 13
- According to information from *Time*, the mini crash of Friday, Oct. 13, 1989, was the second largest drop of the Dow history
- A British study concluded that even though there were less cars on the road on Friday-the-13th (as compared with other Fridays) more accidents occurred
- Certain ocean liners will be held in dock until after midnight to appease passenger's fears on Friday-the-13th
- Mark Twain once was the 13th guest at a dinner party and a friend warned him not to go. "It was bad luck," Twain later told the friend. "They only had food for 12."

You have been welcomed by one of our coordinators when you arrived at your class. A coordinator contacts the instructor of their assigned course about one week in advance, determines what assistance is needed such as handout copies, projector set-up, and preferred room arrangement. The coordinator checks participants in and collects tuition or donations; and the coordinator does the initial announcements and introductions. Most coordinators work at 3-5 courses per semester based upon their schedule and availability. Coordinators attend classes tuition-free. FAQ: Trees on Vacant Lots

Villagers occasionally ask this question: What can I do about a tree on a vacant lot that is leaning toward my house? Below is the answer from your friends in the ACC Department. If you need further assistance, please call 865-458-5408, ext. 4117.

- The POA does not require off-site property owners to maintain their lots.
- If there is a tree on a lot next to you that you think will endanger your home, first make sure it is on an owned lot and not common property or Right of Way; those trees are the responsibility of your POA.
- If it is on a lot and you don't know the owner, ask either ACC or Public Works and they will be happy to give you the name and mailing address ONLY, no other lot information will be given out (this is a new procedure).
- When you determine who the owner is, mail them a letter asking that they look into the problem, and always CC your insurance company.
