United Way Loudon County wraps up its 2015 campaign

United Way has completed its 2015 campaign and has totaled up the results of the drive. The overall county campaign did quite well achieving 99% of its goal of \$475,000, collecting \$470,298. “This represents a great effort by a lot of volunteers as well as the residents of Loudon County, Tellico Village and the employees of Kimberly-Clark, Tate and Lyle and a number of other employees in the county. We are truly grateful to all of these supporters for contributing to our success. “Thanks to all,” said Judy Fenton, the Executive Director of UW of Loudon County. Unfortunately, the Tellico Village drive was not as successful, reaching only 94% of its goal of \$90,000, collecting \$85,329. “Nevertheless, it still represents a significant contribution from Village residents to the overall campaign, and for this we are truly grateful” stated Andy Ewing, the head of the TV Steering Committee and former BOD Chair. The level of success of the overall county campaign means that the 34 partner agencies will receive pretty much the full amount of the grants they requested.

There are a number of troubling aspects about the drive in TV that are causing concern for the UW BOD. First and foremost is the fact that the goal was not reached for the first time in many years. Even more disturbing however is the trend in participation by donors in the Village. In 2013, 565 households participated, in 2014 that figured dropped slightly to 557. In 2015 however, the number dropped to 500, a drop of 57 from the previous year or a percentage falloff of 10.3%. These donors represent only 14% of the 3594 households in the Village. If this trend continues it will become increasingly difficult, if not impossible, for the Village to achieve its goal. This could bode ill for Village organizations such as the TV Volunteer Fire Department, the Computer Users Club Technical Assistance Program and STAYinTV, all of which have received considerable funding from UW over the course of the last several years.

In further examining the data for TV some interesting and disturbing trends emerge. In terms of neighborhood participation rates, Kahite (although not part of the Loudon County campaign) leads with a 50% participation rate. In the main Village, Tommotley led with a participation rate of 17.1%; all of the other neighborhoods ranged down from there to a 10% rate.

A further look at actual contribution data is shown in the table below.

The donors in the top three categories are called Leadership Contributors. They accounted for 58% of funds donated. If the remaining donors were to increase the amount they donated by just \$25, the amount raised would increase by over \$10,000 and place the drive well above its goal of \$90,000.

There are no doubt a number of factors that contribute to this downward trend in both participation rate and donated amount. Many of us are subjected to countless requests for making donations to a variety of charities so it is understandable that many just ignore all of requests. However, Loudon County is a relatively depressed area of the state, and local residents really need the assistance provided by the agencies supported by UW. There are other factors that militate in favor of participating in the campaign. These include the fact that our taxes and cost of living are, in all likelihood, lower than where we moved here from thus enabling us to participate in a campaign of this type. Granted, many of us are already involved in countless service agencies in the county, but in addition to bodies, these agencies also need funds. UW can provide those funds.

Greater participation with the same distribution of donations would most assuredly increase the overall contribution amount. Broader publicizing of the campaign and its goals may help. In any event, the TV UW Steering Committee under the leadership of Andy Ewing, former Chair of the Loudon County BOD, will be meeting to prepare for the 2016 campaign. They will be looking for ideas on how these negative trends can be reversed in 2016 and beyond.

In addition, increased participation by new members joining the Steering Committee would be helpful in generating new ideas on how to energize the campaign. 
Devil's Racetrack is an in-and-out hike along the Cumberland Trail. The trail begins in a section of Cove Lake State Park north of Knoxville. The hike parallels I-75 through the woods crossing over a boulder field before climbing toward the overlook. Along the way, we will pass two waterfalls and cascades. The Devil's Racetrack overlook is a collection of large rocks and offers one of the best views along the Cumberland Trail. The hike is rated moderate for crossing the boulder field and the elevation gain up to the overlook.
