Recycling By the Numbers

Many Villagers have asked questions about the recycling operations of Santek Waste Services, and we are here to clear up any misconceptions or confusion folks might have.

At last month's Public Services Advisory Committee meeting, representatives from Santek and from Rock Tenn were here to present information about how Santek recycles Tellico Village material. It was extremely informative and a bit entertaining.

In a nutshell, Santek delivers Tellico Village trash to the Matlock Bend landfill in Loudon County. They deliver Tellico Village recycling to the Rock Tenn Recycling in Knox County. It is a false rumor that Tellico Village recycling goes to the same place as trash. Again, that is NOT true.

"I have been impressed with the responsiveness of Santek to all of my questions and those of our Villagers," said Jeff Gagley, Public Works Director for the TVPOA. "Tiny Jones, the Santek operations manager for our area, and I stay in close contact to make sure everything gets taken care of correctly."

Trash/Recycling Runs

Santek representatives spoke at the meeting about how they go about their busy schedule and make sure all refuse is properly disposed of. On some neighborhood runs, the trucks make a trash pickup and drop off run, and the same trucks and crews return for a recycling pickup and delivery. Maybe that's how some Villagers have incorrectly concluded that recycling and trash were bound for the same facility. In other neighborhoods there is a separate crew and truck that makes the recycling run.

Hopefully, this information will help Villagers better understand the process Santek uses to service Tellico Village.

How Much Recycling?

Derrick Senter from Rock Tenn said at the meeting how impressed he was with Tellico Village's participation in recycling. Rock Tenn processes 60 to 70 tons of Tellico Village recycling material every month. The number that really impressed Senter was that 84 percent of Villagers participate in recycling. Most East Tennessee communities the size of Tellico Village have about 60 percent participation.

The most entertaining information presented at the meeting was hearing about how recycling material is sorted and processed. Senter described in great detail how their facility separates

non-recyclables that are incorrectly placed in the recycle bins and how the various grades of recyclables are sorted for proper disposition. See the accompanying chart for acceptable and unacceptable items for recycling.

Acceptable Recyclables

Steel Cans and Aluminum Cans

Mixed Paper – any type of material that is 100 percent paper including phone books, Catalogs, magazines, white and colored ledger paper, white and colored note pad paper and stationary, copy paper, NRC forms, sticky notes, envelopes with or without plastic windows, fax paper, manila folders, hanging folders (remove metal bands), paperboard such as cereal boxes, tissue boxes, shredded paper, etc., and paper bags

Books (hard-bound books – books and covers can be recycled in the mixed paper bins)

Clear Glass, Brown Glass, Green Glass

Cardboard (flattened)

Newspaper (including inserts)

Plastics #1 thru #7. These have a recycle logo labeled on containers.

Not necessary to remove labels. Please rinse out all containers.

NOT RECYCLABLE

Scrap metal (lawn mower blades, brake drums, etc.)

Mylar (i.e., shiny silver plastic) things such as potato chip bags or a foil bag to keep items cold/hot

Aluminum foil or pie plates

Plastic containers that hold hazardous waste such as pesticides/herbicides, motor oil and anti-freeze bottles, Heavy plastic wrap (packaging), saran wrap

Window glass, broken windshields, light bulbs or any type of porcelain or pottery material such as plates or pots

Carbon paper, and Styrofoam

Milk cartons and food and orange juice containers made of paper and coated with a chemical material inside and/or outside, Plastic Pools and water hoses

NO MEDICAL WASTE! Insulin sharps or sharps containers are NOT accepted either inside plastic bottles or by themselves. These items can be disposed of in your household trash inside plastic bottles or through a proper disposal management company.

Signs in Tellico Village

The TVPOA Board approved the current Blue Book. It includes applicable rules, regulations, and standards to keep Tellico Village beautiful.

With the political season upon us, some Villagers wish to support their favored candidates with signs in their yards. There are some locations around the Village where campaign signs are placed on non-Tellico Village property. For residences, however, the Blue Book does not allow political signs. According to Section D, Part II—Aesthetic and Post Construction Rules, Regulations and Standards:

(31) Rules Regarding Signs

- General—Consistency in the regulation and control of signage throughout Tellico Village contributes to the aesthetics, and is therefore of much benefit to the entire community.
- Definition—“Sign” means any identification, description, illustration, or device which is visible from any public place or is located on private property, is exposed to the public, and which directs attention to a product, service, place, activity, person, institution, business, or solicitation.
- Restrictions and Regulations—Only the following signs are permitted in areas zoned Residential (as indicated upon the applicable recorded subdivision plat):
 - Developer Sales Signs: Signs erected by the Developer in connection with its sales program.
 - Miscellaneous Signs: Except for signs installed by the Developer, only standardized yard, garage and moving sales, auction, and similar signs may be used.
 - Open House Signs: Signs may be displayed only while the home is staffed by agents and is limited to one (1) sign per resident's yard.
 - POA Signs: Signs erected by the POA for the identification of streets, neighborhoods, recreation amenities, traffic control, directional purposes, safety, security, and building permits.
 - Signs of a temporary nature advertising property for sale:
 - Contractor Signs:

- vii. Signs on Common Property: Such signs generally shall not be permitted except as provided in this rule above; however, an application may be considered by the ACC on its individual merit, and if approved, shall not be considered as a precedent. Approval shall be based on purpose, content, color, design, size and location.

d. Prohibited Signs

The following signs are specifically prohibited: SOLD, FOR RENT, POLITICAL, AND ANY OTHER SIGN NOT SPECIFICALLY PERMITTED ABOVE.
