Highlights from the Board Workshop

- Board President Alan Hart kicked off the meeting with a review of what the current Project Implementation Committees (PICs) are working on and their responsibilities. Mr. Hart reminded the audience that none of these projects have been approved, placed into a budget or 5-year plan or funded. That part of the process is yet to come.
- Public Works Director Jeff Gagley began his presentation with the Toqua Clubhouse Project (Refurbish vs. Rebuild).
 - He first pointed out the features of the Refurbish option: Covered drive through, covered patio for dining, expanded uncovered patio, enclosed kitchen equipment area, expanded dining area. There were lots of questions from the attendees (more than 75). Estimated cost: \$1.1 million.
 - Then Mr. Gagley highlighted the features of the Rebuild option: Much larger facility, large covered outdoor seating area, greatly improved aesthetics. Additional questions from the audience. Estimated cost: \$2 million.
- Mr. Gagley then presented the latest update on the Kahite Clubhouse PIC progress. He began by showing highlights from the [2014 Kahite Site Plan](#) that are pertinent to the PIC's project. He then presented highlights of the update: 3800 square foot meeting and exercise space, covered pavilion, vestibule and restrooms. Estimated cost: \$1.2 million.
- The final project presented was the Tanasi Parking Expansion project. Mr. Gagley's presentation was not much different from what was presented at the July 20 Board Meeting. After much discussion and input from audience members, the Board challenged the Tanasi PIC to go back and see if they could find an acceptable amount of additional parking spaces without disturbing the practice green or the 9th green. Ideas presented: Paving present grassy area north of lot, Remove islands within confines of the present parking lots, Change entry to open up more area for parking, Open up truck/trailer parking across 444, and a few others. - POA staff members of the Employee Safety Committee (Mitzi Lane, Cris Carter and Bud Murray) updated the Board on safety programs within the POA. New Safety initiatives are the number one priority this year for the employees. The committee presented information about training, accident investigation and benchmarking. The good news: there have been ZERO lost days due to workplace accidents in the POA this year.
- Finally, Finance Director Parker Owen presented the 2017 Budget and 5-year plan guidelines that have been presented to the department managers and discussed at the July Finance Advisory Committee meeting. The serious and substantive budget meetings begin later this month.

Jim also serves as Secretary on the Tennessee Section PGA Board of Directors and is on the Board of Directors of the Tennessee Golf Foundation. Jim is also a regular speaker for the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America, the Tennessee Turfgrass Association and the PGA of America.

Through Jim's mentorship, we have had several of our golf professionals and golf course superintendents sought after by new opportunities outside of Tellico Village to expand their horizons. Their new opportunities provide openings for new employees to join the successful Tellico Village Golf Community and Jim's "team." The volunteer members of the Property Owner staffed Golf Advisory Committee are also happy to be members of Jim's "unofficial team" as well.
