Street restoration in Toqua begins Sept. 27

As most Villagers know, the Public Works Department works with contractors each year to rejuvenate the roads within Tellico Village. This year, the Toqua neighborhood is the area being treated with Pavement Dressing Conditioner (PDC). PDC and products like it help extend the life of the pavement. The information below is provided by the contractor for this year's pavement rejuvenation process, Southern Construction. Please do not hesitate to call any of the numbers below for clarification or questions.

According to Southern Construction Group, street restoration in the Toqua Neighborhood is scheduled to begin Sept. 27:

There will be traffic control personnel on site. We will be making one-way streets where possible. All emergency vehicles will have access 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We will have traffic control at cul-de-sacs where one way is not possible. Do not walk or drive on treated streets. It will track on driveways, sidewalks and carpet. Streets will be closed for up to 24-36 hours. We will have parking available at the Community Church at Tellico Village if you wish to take your car out of closed areas. Southern Construction will be available with 1-hour notice to take you to and from your home and car. Please limit your travel. Dates may change according to weather.

We ask for your cooperation and patience and ask you to limit your travel during restoration. Streets may be closed to two-lane traffic for up to 24-36 hours after restoration.

HELPFUL HINTS:

- You will be responsible for protecting your driveway or landscape stone next to roadway from overspray of the material being applied to the roadway. POA will have paper to protect your driveway if needed, at the Public Works after 9/19/16. Please use secure methods of protecting your driveway. (Wind and Rain) **WARNING THIS PRODUCT WILL NOT COME OFF CONCRETE DRIVEWAYS, STAINED, OR PAINTED.** Southern Construction will not be responsible for driveways, landscaping items or stone.
- Notify landscapers, other construction crews, or any outside service.
- Dry time may take up to 24-36 hours.
- If walked or driven on before having time to cure, sealant will track on sidewalks, carpet, hardwood floors, tile or inside of cars and **SOUTHERN CONSTRUCTION** will not be responsible.
- There will be a distinct, harmless odor.
- Please shut down all sprinkler systems.
- If there is a chance of rain, high winds, or a late start due to weather, **SOUTHERN CONSTRUCTION** may cut back area or push the project back a day or more.

- 24-hour security will be provided only at the designated parking area at the Community Church at Tellico Village.
- Security starts Sept. 26 at 3 p.m. and ends Oct. 2 at 3 p.m.

This loop is located off of the Cumberland Trail in the Tennessee River Gorge Segment, west of Chattanooga in the Prentice-Cooper Forest. The first part of the trail is flat and easy passing through a pleasant forest on the plateau.

The trail then descends into the forest following a creek and then continues with a series of gentle climbing and descending throughout the 10 mile loop. Points of interest are Snoopers Rock with wide open views of the Tennessee River gorge from a large rock bluff, Mullens Cove overlook, and a natural rockhouse and stone door.
