Street Restoration in Toqua Begins Sept. 27

As most Villagers know, the Public Works Department works with contractors each year to rejuvenate the roads within Tellico Village. This year, the Toqua neighborhood is the area being treated with Pavement Dressing Conditioner (PDC). PDC and products like it help extend the life of the pavement. The information below is provided by the contractor for this year's pavement rejuvenation process, Southern Construction. This is the third year Southern Construction has performed the asphalt rejuvenation process. Please do not hesitate to call any of the numbers below for clarification or questions.

HELPFUL REMINDERS

- Residents are responsible for protecting your driveway or landscape stone adjacent to the roadway from overspray of the material being applied to the roadway. POA has paper to protect your driveway, if needed, at Public Works. Please use secure methods of protecting your driveway. **WARNING THIS PRODUCT WILL NOT COME OFF OF CONCRETE DRIVEWAYS (STAINED OR PAINTED)**. Southern Construction is not responsible for driveways, landscaping items or stone.
- Notify landscapers, other construction crews, or any outside service of the need to reschedule work to accommodate the rejuvenation process.
- Dry time may take up to 24-36 hours.
- If walked or driven on before having time to cure, the PDC will track on sidewalks, carpet, hardwood floors, tile or inside of cars and **SOUTHERN CONSTRUCTION** cannot be held liable.
- There will be a distinct but harmless odor.
- Please shut down all sprinkler systems.
- If there is a chance of rain, high winds, or a late start due to weather, **SOUTHERN CONSTRUCTION** may adjust the schedule for a particular area or push the project back a day or more.

- There is courtesy parking in a designated area at the Community Church of Tellico Village.

This loop is located off of the Cumberland Trail in the Tennessee River Gorge Segment, west of Chattanooga in the Prentice-Cooper Forest. The first part of the trail is flat and easy passing through a pleasant forest on the plateau.

The trail then descends into the forest following a creek and then continues with a series of gentle climbing and descending throughout the 10 mile loop. Points of interest are Snoopers Rock with wide open views of the Tennessee River gorge from a large rock bluff, Mullens Cove overlook, and a natural rockhouse and stone door.
