Welcome Center One-Year Anniversary

It was late September of 2015 when we cut the ribbon on the new Tellico Village Welcome Center. It had been part of the Tellico Village Property Owners Association's (TVPOA) long-term plan to acquire a building where visitors to our community could be greeted and learn more about this great place. Last year we opened just the place.

Since the opening last Sept. 28, the Welcome Center has been abuzz with activity. We have seen hundreds of visitors come through the doors as it is the launching pad for the Discovery Tours. While I am on that subject, I want to say a great big thank you to our volunteer tour guides who do such a great job of showing our visitors the beauty and friendliness of Tellico Village.

Along with tour activity, the Welcome Center is the place for the periodic classic car cruise-ins featuring vehicles from the various car clubs. The Center has hosted a job fair where the TVPOA interviewed and recruited dozens of potential employees. Several dignitaries have stopped by to check out our new digs as well. The most notable was Tennessee State Commissioner for Tourism Kevin Triplett.

In the year before we opened the Welcome Center, only 15 or so visitors found our marketing department by stopping by the TVPOA offices. In the year since, more than 1,500 visitors have found us. In fact, August was a banner month with 232 unplanned visitors stopping by.

The Welcome Center has been a game changer for our Day Tours program as well. Last year, less than half the tours of Tellico Village were Day Tours. This year, Day Tours are outpacing Discovery Tours 162 to 110. Both of those programs are well on their way to record breaking numbers since we started the marketing program in 2013.

Villagers are more than welcome to stop by the Welcome Center. There you will find the

offices for Marketing Manager Beth Kuberka, Marketing Assistant Summer Macon, Lifestyle Coordinator Lisa McCray, and of course, you will be greeted by Public Relations Assistant and Welcome Center Greeting Patty Robichaud. Patty is also a notary public and has notarized more than 60 documents since March. These professionals can answer any questions you may have about the marketing of Tellico Village and how our visitor programs are progressing.

Boating in cold waters (typically) under 60 degrees requires special considerations and preparations. Boats are often smaller, trailerable and with low freeboard. Many small boats are aluminum so positive flotation is important. Personal flotation is even more important. Boat load capacity and gear storage are just some of the issues to be considered when boating in colder waters. Duck hunters, deer hunters and fishermen are often unaware of cold water limitations and dangers. Boating in the late Fall, through the Winter and during the early Spring can be a beautiful time to enjoy mother nature. However, it also brings additional risks that you should anticipate and be prepared. This seminar has been developed to give cold water boaters the information they need to

survive the unexpected.
