Truth Be Told: Yacht Club Gas Dock

Question: The gas dock at the Yacht Club has been running slowly lately. Why is that? What is the POA going to do to address the issue?

Answer: Thank you for your question. We have had an issue this year with sediment in the tank clogging up the filters. It is NOT a condensation or rust issue. It is due to particles in the system, and the filters are doing their job. However, it definitely slows down the dispensing of fuel. Once boating season winds down, we plan to take the-fueling system off line for a few days so we can have the 4,000-gallon storage tank cleaned out and fully address the issue. Safe boating everyone!

Attention Tellico Village Residents:

Santek Waste Services has announced a small rate increase to go into effect Nov. 1. The rate hike is 38 cents per quarter or 1%. The new rate for residential trash and recycle pickup will be \$38.42 (for paying by cash or check).

This is the first rate increase from Santek since they began service in Tellico Village in November of 2014. Rate increases are allowed under specific restrictions as outlined in the Santek contract with Tellico Village Property Owners Association. The graphic below is a copy

Acceptable Recyclables

Steel Cans and Aluminum Cans

Mixed Paper – any type of material that is 100 percent paper including phone books, catalogs, magazines, white and colored ledger paper, white and colored note pad paper and stationary, copy paper, NRC forms, sticky notes, envelopes with or without plastic windows, fax paper, manila folders, hanging folders (remove metal bands), paperboard such as cereal boxes, tissue boxes, shredded paper, etc., and paper bags

Books (hard-bound books – books and covers can be recycled in the mixed paper bins)

Clear Glass, Brown Glass, Green Glass

Cardboard (flattened)

Newspaper (including inserts)

Plastics #1 thru #7. These have a recycle logo labeled on containers.

Not necessary to remove labels. Please rinse out all containers.

NOT RECYCLABLE

Scrap metal (lawn mower blades, brake drums, etc.)

Mylar (i.e., shiny silver plastic) things such as potato chip bags or a foil bag to keep items cold/hot

Aluminum foil or pie plates

Plastic containers that hold hazardous waste such as pesticides/herbicides, motor oil and antifreeze bottles, Heavy plastic wrap (packaging), saran wrap

Window glass, broken windshields, light bulbs or any type of porcelain or pottery material such as plates or pots

Carbon paper, and Styrofoam

Milk cartons and food and orange juice containers made of paper and coated with a chemical material inside and/or outside, Plastic Pools and water hoses

NO MEDICAL WASTE! Insulin sharps or sharps containers are NOT accepted either inside plastic bottles or by themselves. These items can be disposed of in your household trash inside plastic bottles or through a proper disposal management company.

C.O.P.'s House Check Forms now available at TV Welcome Center

House Check Forms and lock boxes are in two locations: the TV Welcome Center, 202 Chota Rd., and the Tanasi Club House. The lock box has been moved from the Public Library at Tellico Village to the more centralized location with additional hours of operation. Forms may also be downloaded from the [HOA website](#) and dropped off at either location.

COPs (Citizens Observer Patrol) is a cooperative effort between the Loudon County Sheriff's Office and volunteers concerned about the welfare and security of Tellico Village residents. As such, house checks are only performed in Tellico Village. During a house check an exterior inspection is done by making a complete walk around of the house, where conditions permit, in addition to patrolling the area where the home is located. COP volunteers patrol over 250 hours each month.

Boating in cold waters (typically) under 60 degrees requires special considerations and preparations. Boats are often smaller, trailerable and with low freeboard. Many small boats are aluminum so positive flotation is important. Personal flotation is even more important. Boat load capacity and gear storage are just some of the issues to be considered when boating in colder waters. Duck hunters, deer hunters and fishermen are often unaware of cold water limitations and dangers. Boating in the late Fall, through the Winter and during the early Spring can be a beautiful time to enjoy mother nature. However, it also brings additional risks that you should anticipate and be prepared. This seminar has been developed to give cold water boaters the information they need to survive the unexpected.
